VISIT REPORT

Visit to Water Treatment Plant, Laxmitek

A visit to Water Treatment Plant, Laxmitek was organized by KAHERE Institute of nursing Sciences Belagavi, department of community health nursing for the students of final year B.Sc and Diploma students of KAHER Institute of Nursing Science Belagavi on 06-06-2023. The students were accompanied by the Faculty of community health nursing department. At the water treatment plant students were divided into 2 groups and were accompanied by Mr.Vinod, clerk to give information about purification of water.

Mr. Vinod clerk explained that the raw water is received from Hidkal, Rakasakoppa and other parts of Belagavi. This water is subjected to violent agitation in mixing chamber after adding alum for few minutes. This is done to remove turbidity in the water. Alum enables suspended particles to aggregate. This water is passed into the flocculation chamber where it is agitated for 30min. It results in formation of thick precipitate. This coagulated water moves to sedimentation tank for settling down of impurities and water looks clearer. The water is subjected to rapid sand filtration for filtration. The filtered water is disinfected using chlorine which kills bacteria and makes water suitable for public consumption. This water is pumped to the reservoir tank from where it is supplies to Hindalco factory, KLE hospital, Markandaya Sugar Mills and other parts of Belagavi.

Mr. Vinod was thanked for his co-operation and his informative explanation about purification of water. Around 60 Nursing students and 05 faculty from KAHER INS benefited from the programme.

VISIT REPORT

Visit to Water Treatment Plant, Laxmitek

A visit to Water Treatment Plant, Laxmitek was organized by KAHERE Institute of nursing Sciences Belagavi, department of community health nursing for the students of final year B.Sc and Diploma students of KAHER Institute of Nursing Science Belagavi on 06-06-2023. The students were accompanied by the Faculty of community health nursing department. At the water treatment plant students were divided into 2 groups and were accompanied by Mr.Vinod, clerk to give information about purification of water.

Mr. Vinod clerk explained that the raw water is received from Hidkal, Rakasakoppa and other parts of Belagavi. This water is subjected to violent agitation in mixing chamber after adding alum for few minutes. This is done to remove turbidity in the water. Alum enables suspended particles to aggregate. This water is passed into the flocculation chamber where it is agitated for 30min. It results in formation of thick precipitate. This coagulated water moves to sedimentation tank for settling down of impurities and water looks clearer. The water is subjected to rapid sand filtration for filtration. The filtered water is disinfected using chlorine which kills bacteria and makes water suitable for public consumption. This water is pumped to the reservoir tank from where it is supplies to Hindalco factory, KLE hospital, Markandaya Sugar Mills and other parts of Belagavi.

Mr. Vinod was thanked for his co-operation and his informative explanation about purification of water. Around 60 Nursing students and 05 faculty from KAHER INS benefited from the programme.

INTRODUCTION & NEED FOR STUDY:

The Covid-19 pandemic has a devastating effect throughout the world. While most patients with mild infection recover within 2-3 months, a large percentage of patients experience symptoms persisting much longer which is termed as the Long Covid Syndrome (LCS). One of the significant symptoms of LCS is Paraspinal Myalgia (1). LCS related myopathy can result in muscle weakness, spasms, and is associated with denervation atrophy, deconditioning and sarcopenia in patients (1) which adversely affects their daily life. Globally around 72% patients with post-acute COVID-19 reported fatigue, while spine pain was present in 71% patients and myalgias and arthralgias were noted in 61% and 44% of patients, respectively (2). Of the variety of cytokine storm and chemokine response, IL-17 was found to have closest molecular signature to Long Covid. (3)

A widely known method to treat musculoskeletal pain in patients is use of Jacobson's Progressive Muscle Relaxation Therapy (PMRT). PMRT is a type of relaxation therapy that

involves tensing and relaxing a group of muscles in a specific sequence along with controlled breathing. PMRT is known to help decrease pain in non-pharmacological ways (4). There is extensive research on positive effects of PMRT in reducing postoperative pain in patients, especially in surgeries of the paraspinal region (5), and improvement in overall quality of life in patients (6). Spinal Muscle Training (SMT) will be incorporated along with PMRT to complement the recovery of participants. Research studies suggest that SMT involving spinal flexion and extension exercises is helpful in faster recovery from low back pain problems (7).

By 2021, the World bank predicted a 64 % of population residing in rural India. A potential way to address health needs and patient compliance is Telerehabilitation (TR). TR involves coaching, consultation, and evaluation through audio and video conferencing sessions, hence bridging cost commutes, increasing participation, eliminating healthcare worker shortages and helping with better coordination with the participants to improve outcomes. As a policy directive for Digital India framed by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, TR has shown promising results in rural areas. The target population of this study are the laborers of Belgaum district, North Karnataka, who developed Paraspinal myalgia due to LCS which adversely affected their ability to perform their daily occupation.

This study aims to bridge the gap between health education and management and transform healthcare to underutilized areas for better patient compliance and effective options for caregivers.

OBJECTIVES OF THE STUDY –

- a) **Primary Objectives:** To evaluate the effect of PMRT and SMT in the recovery of manual laborers aged 40 50 years suffering from paraspinal myalgia post COVID-19 infection, over 16 weeks.
- b) **Secondary Objectives:** To assess the effectiveness of the above-stated methods on reduction of pain and disability in the study population using
 - i) Oswestry Disability Pain Index
 - ii) Katz Index of Activities of Daily living
 - iii) Pre & Post Telerehabilitation Questionnaire

METHODOLOGIES

• Inclusion Criteria –

- a) Males of 40 50 years of age, indulging in hard manual labor.
- b) Have been infected with COVID-19 and developed paraspinal myalgia post-infection.
- c) Free from heart disease and diabetes mellitus.

• Exclusion criteria –

- a) People using muscle relaxants.
- b) Female laborers due to higher risk of osteoporotic fractures in women of that age group (8).
- c) Patients suffering from rheumatoid, psoriatic arthritis myositis.

• Arms and Interventions –

- a) Experimental group The participants will receive PMRT & SMT under guided supervision.
- b) Non-Experimental Group The participants will receive Standard Neurosurgical care (SNC) only.

Data Collection Methods –

a) Pre & post-experiment testing through Cytokine IL17 biomarker measurement to assess the level of Long Covid Inflammation and pain in both experimental and non-experimental groups. (3)

Test used – Finetest Human IL-17 ELISA Kit Range – 31.25 – 2000 pg/ml Sensitivity – 18.75 pg/ml

b) Oswestry Disability index -

It was developed by Fairbank et al (1980) and it has been used to measure functional disability in people with low back pain. This questionnaire consists of ten questions that assess the level of pain and its interference with several physical activities: sleeping, self-care, sex life, social life, and traveling.

For each question, there are possible 5 points, the first option being 0, the second option being 1 point, and so on till 5 points for the 6th option.

Scoring System -

0-4 points: No disability

5 - 14: Mild disability

15 – 24: Moderate disability

25 - 34: Severe disability

35 - 50: Completely disabled

c) Katz Index of Activities of Daily living –

It was developed by Katz et al (1963). This is a tool to assess functional status of the participant's ability to perform activities of daily living independently. The Index ranks adequacy of performance in six functions: bathing, dressing, toileting, transferring, continence, and feeding. One point means the person is independent; zero points means the person requires supervision and personal assistance.

d) Pre & Post Telerehabilitation Questionnaire

Experimental Protocol –

- i) This study will involve the formation of two Focused self-help groups, the experimental group receiving PMRT & SMT and the non-experimental group receiving SNC only.
- ii) Participants will be asked to attend the sessions physically 3 days in the first week in respective OPD and IPD at the hospital, and follow-ups will be conducted post-discharge through Telerehabilitation, to assess their responses personally effectively.
- iii) Procedure of Telerehabilitation post discharge from the hospital –

The Experimental and non-experimental groups will be engaged in separate zoom video calls of 60 minutes, 3 alternate days a week. Participants will be asked to answer the TR Questionnaire in a diary, before and after every TR session. They will be assessed personally during these sessions

regarding their pain and daily life activities, post which the participants will be engaged in their respective protocols mentioned below.

iv) SOP for the experimental group sessions -


The consequences of the long COVID-19 are impacting healthcare resources, as up to 30% due to prolonged disability induced by COVID-19 rather than mortality. Knowledge of long-term outcomes among COVID survivors with paraspinal myalgia is scarce. Understanding Effective muscle relaxation therapies can prevent the development of long-term complications and guide strategies in the future. Our study tries to meet the health needs by incorporating treatment modalities into Telerehabilitation and making it a more home-based application and a cost-effective flexible way for service delivery.

Introduction & Need for Study:

Music therapy is the clinical and evidence-based use of music interventions to accomplish individualized goals within a therapeutic relationship by a credentialed professional who has completed an approved music therapy program.^[1] An evidence-based treatment that helps with a variety of disorders including cardiac conditions, depression, autism, substance abuse and Alzheimer's disease.

CBT involves multiple individual sessions with a trained therapist. The patients feel that they are in a safe space in order to confront painful or difficult thoughts, feelings and situations. In some cases, sessions can take place remotely. There are a number of different elements and strategies used in CBT, including education (specifically, "psychoeducation") to help identify unhealthy thoughts and coping skills training that might include deep breathing and muscle relaxation techniques. Music is used to reinforce some behaviors and modify others. This approach is structured, not improvisational, and may include listening to music, dancing, singing, or playing an instrument.

To address negative thinking, CBT often includes a technique called reframing. Reframing is a way to think about a problem differently. For example, someone who struggles with road rage might usually assume the worst of another driver. CBT would suggest a different perspective, with more concern for the other person. Maybe that other driver was dealing with a medical emergency, or terrified about being late to work, or struggling with something in their

personal life that has nothing to do with you. This approach can help build empathy for others, instead of anger.

The impact of various genres of music and musical activities as a form of positive reinforcement, the ability of music to serve as a stimulus for new behaviour to be developed, its accessibility as a pleasant event, and its ability to evoke mood change make music a valuable resource.

CBMT practitioners utilize music therapy activities such as songwriting, lyric substitution, and improvisation that are commonly employed by music therapists of other persuasions. However, for cognitive-behavioral music therapists, their intentions for presenting these activities and the manner in which the activities are implemented represent the specific values of cognitive and behavioral ideologies.

Benenzon Model of Music Therapy (BMMT) combines some concepts of psychoanalysis with the process of making music. It includes the search for the patients "musical sound identity," which describes the external sounds that most closely matches the internal psychological state. A music therapy framework based on non-verbal psychoanalytical [2] theories.

The sessions will be developed with a weekly frequency. The sessions will comprise of active and passive techniques with the understanding that the singing, playing, improvising and listening are musical activities that are used for therapeutic purposes and are determined by the individual characteristics. This session can take place in a group of 20-30 patients comprising both the genders.

Treatment will include pieces of music of various genres depending on the Musical History of patients. The genre of music the patients like to hear and usually hear. The subject population of our research project will be Oncosurvivors. We would do a qualitative as well as quantitative study. We will do a study which would include the following parameters – the effect of a specific music genre on Anxiety, Depression and the brain activity using EEG and BERA.

Rates of depression in cancer survivors five years following diagnosis were demonstrated to be 8-24%. Approximately 18-20% of long-term cancer adult survivors report anxiety symptoms. Musical training can have strong effects on the structural and cognitive development of brain. [3-7]

Objectives: -

The objectives of this research is to see the effect of the parameters that are attention, activity of daily living, task behaviour, cardiac autonomic activity and pain threshold by music therapy on Oncosurvivors. We will club attention and task behaviour as Cognitive and Cardiac Activity.

Experimental protocol: -

The subject was prepared with an EEG recording cap with 19 electrodes (Ag/AgCl sintered ring electrodes) placed in the international 10/20 system. Impedances were checked below 5 kilo Ohm. The EEG recording system (Recorders and Medicare Systems) was operated at 256 sample/s recording on customized software of RMS.

The data was band-pass-filtered between 0 and 50 Hz to remove DC drifts. Each subject was seated comfortably in a relaxed condition in a chair in a shielded measurement cabin. They were also asked to

close their eyes. After initialization, a 20 min recording period was started, and the following protocol was followed:

- 1. 2 min 30 seconds "Before imagination"
- 2. 2 min 30 seconds "While imagination raga Jay Jayanti
- 3. 2 min 30 seconds "After imagination"
- 4. 5 min resting period
- 5. 2 min 30 seconds "Before Listening"
- 6. 2 min 30 seconds "With listening raga Jay Jayanti"
- 7. 2 min 30 seconds "After listening".

We divided each of the experimental conditions in three windows of 45 seconds each and calculated the cross-correlation coefficient for each window.

Methodology: -

An electroencephalogram (EEG) is a test that measures electrical activity in the brain using small, metal discs (electrodes) attached to the scalp. Brain cells communicate via electrical impulses and are active all the time, even during asleep. This activity shows up as wavy lines on an EEG recording.

Brainstem Evoked Response Audiometry (BERA) is an objective test to understand the transmission of electrical waves from the C-8 nerve to the brainstem, in response to sounds given through the ear. Stimulus is given in the form of a click sound or tone pip, via an ear phone or head phone. The stimulus is of varying loudness and of the frequency range from 1000 to 4000 Hz.

The auditory evoked potential signals produced by the brainstem are recorded as waves containing peaks and troughs. The peaks are

positive potentials that are recorded from the electrode at the vertex and are marked as wave I, wave II and so on up to wave VII.

- Cochlear nerves Wave I and Wave II
- Cochlear nucleus (Brainstem) Wave III
- Superior olivary complex Wave IV
- Lateral lemniscus Wave V
- Inferior colliculus (Midbrain) Waves VI and VII

Hamilton Anxiety Rating Scale (HARS) is clinician-rated scale that is intended to provide an analysis of the severity of anxiety in adults, adolescents, and children. It is scored based upon the composite rating of fourteen individually evaluated criteria.

The scale consists of 14 items designed to assess the severity of a patient's anxiety. Each of the 14 items contains a number of symptoms, and each group of symptoms is rated on a scale of zero to four, with four being the most severe. All of these scores are used to compute an overarching score that indicates a person's anxiety severity.

The 14 designed items are: -

- 1. Anxious mood: Worries, anticipation of the worst, fearful anticipation, irritability.
- 2. Tension: Feelings of tension, fatigability, startle response, moved to tears easily, trembling, feelings of restlessness, inability to relax.
- 3. Fears: Of dark, of strangers, of being left alone, of animals, of traffic, of crowds.
- 4. Insomnia: Difficulty in falling asleep, broken sleep, unsatisfying sleep and fatigue on waking, dreams, nightmares, night terrors.
- 5. Intellectual: Difficulty in concentration, poor memory.
- 6. Depressed mood: Loss of interest, lack of pleasure in hobbies, depression, early waking, diurnal swing.

- 7. Somatic (muscular): Pains and aches, twitching, stiffness, myoclonic jerks, grinding of teeth, unsteady voice, increased muscular tone.
- 8. Somatic (sensory): Tinnitus, blurring of vision, hot and cold flushes, feelings of weakness, pricking sensation.
- 9. Cardiovascular symptoms: Tachycardia, palpitations, pain in chest, throbbing of vessels, fainting feelings, missing beat.
- 10. Respiratory symptoms: Pressure or constriction in chest, choking feelings, sighing, dyspnea.
- 11. Gastrointestinal symptoms: Difficulty in swallowing, wind abdominal pain, burning sensations, abdominal fullness, nausea, vomiting, borborygmi, looseness of bowels, loss of weight, constipation.
- Genitourinary symptoms: Frequency of micturition, urgency of micturition, amenorrhea, menorrhagia, development of frigidity, premature ejaculation, loss of libido, impotence.j
- 13. Autonomic symptoms: Dry mouth, flushing, pallor, tendency to sweat, giddiness, tension headache, raising of hair.
- 14. Behavior at interview: Fidgeting, restlessness or pacing, tremor of hands, furrowed brow, strained face, sighing or rapid respiration, facial pallor, swallowing, etc.

Each item is scored independently based on a five-point, ratio scale. A rating of 0 indicates that the feeling is not present in the patient. A rating of 1 indicates mild prevalence of the feeling in the patient. A rating of 2 indicates moderate prevalence of the feeling in the patient. A rating of 3 indicates severe prevalence of the feeling in the patient. A rating of 4 indicates a very severe prevalence of the feeling in the patient.

Upon the completion of the evaluation, the clinician compiles a total, composite score based upon the summation of each of the 14

individually rated items. This calculation will yield a comprehensive score in the range of 0 to 56. It has been predetermined that the results of the evaluation can be interpreted as follows. A score of 17 or less indicates mild anxiety severity. A score from 18 to 24 indicates mild to moderate anxiety severity. Lastly, a score of 25 to 30 indicates a moderate to severe anxiety severity.

Quality of life is defined by the WHO as "individuals' perceptions of their position in life in the context of the culture and value systems in which they live and in relation to their goals, expectations, standards and concerns.

Previous Experimental Investigations: -

In 2006, breast cancer was the third leading cause of death in American women; however, more women survive breast cancer than any other type of cancer. As the disease progresses, it is important to know how one's health-related quality of life (QOL) is affected for those who receive treatment, those who survive, and those who remain disease-free. The purpose of this study was to summarize the benefits, challenges, and barriers of QOL measurement for female breast cancer patients. A PubMed literature search was conducted using the terms "quality of life" and "breast cancer."

From the results, a detailed outline of QOL instruments is presented, and the effectiveness of QOL instruments is discussed. In the current literature review, both generic and breast cancer specific QOL instruments, examining computerized and paper-and-pencil versions, are explained as well as the advantages, acceptability, and problems of these assessments. Potential barriers to implementation are also discussed. The implementation of QOL assessment tools in breast cancer clinical practice is discussed, with evidence detailing how such tools would benefit patients.

Two major changes in cancer medicine have occurred over the past decade. The first is recognition that the patient's well-being is important to cancer treatment. Another is the use of QOL and psychosocial questionnaires to assess their well-being. Since the time of Hippocrates, QOL has been an implied medical outcome ^[8]. QOL instruments currently are being used in clinical trials to predict

survival, response to treatment, and to screen for psychological morbidity [9].

Findings by Ganz and Goodwin revealed that with the number of survivors growing in recent years, breast cancer patients have been assessed with multiple QOL instruments in order to compare the effects of breast cancer and its treatments to those of people with other chronic illnesses as well as to healthy women.

Donaldson^[10] states that patients report both positive and negative effects of their diagnosis and treatment. QOL assessments can be used in diagnosis, predicting prognosis, assessment, patient monitoring, clinical decision-making, communication, and treatment.

Instrumental in reviewing breast cancer outcomes, Mandelblatt and colleagues (2004) conducted a meta-analysis utilizing 230 articles from 1990 to 2000. Primary conclusions drawn from this study include the majority of articles utilized health-related QOL outcomes, no single instrument was utilized in more than 10% of all the articles, most articles had a primarily white population and did not focus on elderly breast cancer patients, and methodological flaws were prevalent throughout the studies analyzed.

Because of the complexity of breast cancer and the diverse nature of its patient population, no one instrument is both comprehensive and sensitive enough to report clinically meaningful changes in all outcomes across all phases of care and has satisfactory respondent or provider burden. However, based on Mandelblatt's et al. comprehensive meta-analysis of breast cancer outcomes literature, they believe it is possible to develop a "core" set of questions to measure breast cancer outcomes. After reviewing the articles retrieved in the PubMed search, 21 QOL instruments were identified as being the most used assessments within the breast cancer population.

97% of the patients stated that the QOL profile provided an accurate summary of their functioning and well-being. Fifty-seven percent reported their physicians used the profile explicitly during their visits, 79% believed the profile enhanced physician awareness of their health problems, and 87% thought it would be useful to introduce a QOL assessment as a standard part of the outpatient clinical experience.

The effect of EEG biofeedback on reducing post cancer cognitive impairment (PCCI):

PCCI is observed in a substantial number of breast cancer survivors, persisting for as long as 20 years in some subgroups. Although compensatory strategies are frequently suggested, no restorative interventions have yet been identified. This study examined the feasibility of EEG biofeedback ("neurofeedback") and its potential effectiveness in reducing PCCI as well as the fatigue, sleep disturbance, and psychological symptoms that frequently accompany PCCI.

All 23 participants completed the study, demonstrating the feasibility of EEG biofeedback in this population. Initially, the sample demonstrated significant dysfunction on all measures compared with general population norms. Repeated-measures ANOVAs revealed strongly significant improvements (P < .001) on all 4 cognitive measures (perceived cognitive impairment, comments from others, perceived cognitive abilities, and impact on quality of life [QOL]), the fatigue scale, and the 4 psychological scales (somatization, depression, anxiety and global severity index) as well as on 3 of 8 sleep scales (quality, daytime dysfunction, and global). Two of the other sleep scales (latency and disturbance) were significant at P < .01, and 1 (use of medication) at P < .05; 2 were not significant. Improvements were generally linear across the course of training,

and were maintained at the follow-up testing. At the follow-up testing, the sample no longer differed significantly from normative populations on 3 of the 4 FACT-Cog measures (impairment, impact on QOL, and comments), FACIT-Fatigue, PSQI sleep quality and habitual efficiency, or any of the BSI-18 measures of psychological disturbance. Data from this limited study suggest that EEG biofeedback has potential for reducing the negative cognitive and emotional sequelae of cancer treatment as well as improving fatigue and sleep patterns.

WHY MUSIC THERAPY FOR ONCOSURVIVORS?

The Use of Music Therapy During the Treatment of Cancer Patients: A Collection of Evidence: We found a total of 12 clinical studies conducted between 2001 and 2011 comprised of a total of 922 patients. Eight studies had a randomized controlled design, and four studies were conducted in the field of pediatric oncology. Studies reported heterogeneous results on short-term improvements in patients' mood and relaxation and reduced exhaustion and anxiety as well as in coping with the disease and cancer-related pain. Case descriptions showed similar effects in expressing emotions, opening up new goals, and turning the mind toward a healthy process and away form a disease-centered focus.

The use of music therapy in the integrative treatment of cancer patients is a therapeutic option whose salutogenetic potential is shown in many case studies such as those presented here. Study results, however, did not draw a conclusive picture of the overall effect of music therapy. In addition to further clinical trials, the evidence mosaic should be complemented with qualitative studies, single case descriptions, and basic research.

6. Title of the proposed research project:

Influence of different music genress on autonomic system functionality regulating various systemic physiological functions.

7. Introduction and Need for the study:

As music listening is a popular activity of daily life, it is of utmost importance to study the effects of music listening on psychobiological stress in everyday, daily-life settings. Music is widely used to enhance well-being, reduce stress, and distract patients from unpleasant symptoms. Although there are wide variations in individual

preferences, music appears to exert direct physiologic effects through the autonomic nervous system. It also has indirect effects by modifying caregiver behaviour. Music effectively reduces anxiety and improves mood for medical and surgical patients1, for patients in intensive care units and patients undergoing procedures, and for children as well as adults.

Music is a low-cost intervention that often reduces surgical, procedural, acute, and chronic pain. Music also improves the quality of life for patients receiving palliative care, enhancing a sense of comfort and relaxation. Providing music to caregivers may be a cost-effective and enjoyable strategy to improve empathy, compassion, and relationship-centered care while not increasing errors or interfering with technical aspects of care. Although music is predominantly utilized for religious, enjoyment, or entertainment purposes, it is gradually emerging as a promising nonpharmacological intervention for improving health outcomes in both healthy and diseased populations, especially in those with cardiovascular diseases2. As such, music of various genress and types has been postulated to possess features that stimulate or inhibit the autonomic nervous system, which leads to variable effects on cardiovascular function. However, music intervention has not been adequately explored as a cardiovascular therapeutic modality due to the lack of extensive studies with a qualitative methodology. Thus, this systematic review aims to explore the available literature on the effect of music on the cardiovascular system, discuss the limitations of current research, and suggest future directions in this field.

The prevalence of pre-hypertension is higher among young adults and may increase the risk for hypertension and cardiovascular morbidity. Music therapy has been investigated to reduce blood pressure in the hypertensive population3; however, its efficacy on blood pressure in pre-hypertensive young adults is not known. As pharmacological treatment of hypertension has become a burden worldwide, the study looked into nonpharmacological ways of reducing blood pressure4.

Thus, all these encourage us to look into the Effect of different genress of music on the autonomic system regulating various systemic physiological functions. Therefore, in this study, we aim to find how listening to music affects our psychobiological behaviour, so the following study was aimed.

Objective of the study

- To assess the influence of Classical music on autonomic control of sweat-reflex, cardiovascular system, respiratory system and pupillary reaction.
- To assess the influence of Jazz music on autonomic control of sweat-reflex, cardiovascular system, respiratory system and pupillary reaction.
- To assess the influence of hip-hop music on autonomic control of sweat-reflex, cardiovascular system, respiratory system and pupillary reaction.
- To assess the influence of pop music on autonomic control of sweat-reflex, cardiovascular system, respiratory system and pupillary reaction.
- To assess the influence of Rock music on autonomic control of sweat-reflex, cardiac and vascular systems, respiratory system and pupillary reaction.

8. Materials and Methods

- **8.1 Source of Data:** Adolescent in the age group of 18-25yrs, belonging to student community of our college will be enrolled in our study.
- **8.2 Study Design:** Cross-sectional interventional trial.
- **8.3 Study Period:** 2months (Part of STS-ICMR project proposal)
- **8.4 Sample Size: 30**
- **8.5 Sampling technique:** Simple random sampling

8.9 Data collection procedure:

6 students with 3girls and 3boys will be part of 1 group. Such 5 groups will be part of 5 groups with different music genres. Following will be the 5 genres of music used, the music chosen will be instrumental in all genres's.

<u>Group 1</u>: Classical – Classical instrumental flute music (Raga Malkauns)

<u>Group 2</u>: Jazz – TrinitySnarky Puppy.

Group 3: Hiphop - "KARMA III" Hip Hop Instrumental Beat.

<u>Group 4</u>: Pop – Instrumental pop music by Sonu Nigam

<u>Group 5</u>: Rock - Nirvana, AC/DC, Deep Purple, Metallica Heavy Metal Hard Rock Music Instrumental 80's & 90's

Autonomic tests for various systems:

All the participants will undergo following test with background music of their allotted genres of music. A break of 15minutes will be given between 2 tests where no music will be played and the participant will be made to sit in silence.

• Skin

The skin area over the right forearm will be manually dried and completely covered with an indicator dye (povidone-iodine mixed with cornstarch and mineral oil for liquefaction). The color change of the used indicator marks the appearance of sweat droplets on the skin. The core temperature will be raised by 1 °C by immersion of the hand in hot water (oral temperature measured by a digital thermometer). Normally, sweating will occur within 2 minutes. Color change due to axon-reflex sweating will be assessed by repeated digital photography with pictures taken every 15 s over a genresl time of 7 min. Time of onset and progression will be compared in all participants.

• Cardiovascular system

Tests of the cardiovascular system can be divided into those testing parasympathetic function (heart rate to deep breathing and Valsalva maneuver) and others testing sympathetic function (response of blood pressure to standing and to sustained hand grip). All the tests will be performed and analysed for variable scores as follows.

a) Heart rate to deep breathing: baseline heart rate will be recorded. In sitting position, Patients will be asked to take 6 deep breaths per minute (with 5 s of inhalation and 5 s of exhalation per breath). A continuous ECG will be recorded, with marker to indicate the onset of each inspiration and expiration. Maximum and minimum R-R intervals will be measured during each breathing cycle and converted into beats per minute. The result will be expressed as mean of the difference between maximum and minimum heart rate for six measured cycles in beats per minute. Normal response is a difference of 18 beats per minute or more. The expiratory-inspiratory

- ratio (E : I ratio), which is the ratio of the longest RR interval during expiration and the shortest RR interval during inspiration from 5 cycles, was also determined.
- b) Heart rate response to Valsalva maneuver: Subjects will be asked to blow into a mouthpiece connected to a mercury manometer and hold it at a pressure of 40 mmHg for 15 seconds, simultaneously monitored by the ECG. The ECG will be continued to be recorded 15 seconds after the release of pressure. The induced heart rate changes will be expressed as Valsalva ratio i.e ratio of maximum tachycardia (shortest R-R interval) during the manoeuvre to the maximum bradycardia (longest R-R interval) after the manoeuvre. Normal Valsalva ratio is 1.45 or more.
- c) Response of blood pressure to standing: The patient changes from the lying to the standing position while a continuous ECG (lead II) is recorded. The result is expressed as the ratio between the R-R interval at beat 30 and the R-R interval at beat 15. A ratio of 1.05 or higher is considered normal.
- d) Response of blood pressure to sustained hand grip: Using a hand grip dynamometer, a maximum voluntary contraction is first determined and then maintained at 30% of that maximum for as long as possible. The blood pressure is measured before and at 1-minute intervals during hand grip. The result is expressed as the difference between the highest diastolic pressure during hand grip and the diastolic pressure before hand grip. A rise of more than 10 mm Hg during hand grip is normally expected.

• Respiratory system

Baseline BP will be monitored, subject will be asked to hyperventilate for 30sec and simultaneously HR and blood pressure will be monitored. Initial drop in MAP followed by a reflex baroreceptor induced rise in MAP will be recorded. Inter individual variations will be noted.

Pupils

The parasympathetic supply is concerned with constriction and the sympathetic with dilation. A normal pupillary light response needs both the autonomic arms intact. The Neurological Pupil index will be calculated by the Pupillometer. The QP parameters included Max (mm), Min (mm) and percentage of change (CH = $100 \times [\text{Max} - \text{Min}]/\text{Max}$), constriction velocity (CV, mm/sec), latency of constriction (Lat, msec), dilation velocity (DV, mm/sec), and Neurological Pupil index (NPi). Variations with

each group will be analysed.

• Skin:

The skin area over the right forearm will be manually dried and completely covered with an indicator dye The color change of the used indicator marks the appearance of sweat droplets on the skin. The core temperature will be raised by 1 °C by immersion of the hand in hot water.

• <u>Cardiovascular system:</u>

Tests of the cardiovascular system can be divided into those testing parasympathetic and others testing sympathetic function.

a. Heart rate to deep breathing: In sitting position, Patients will be asked to take 6 deep breaths per minute (with 5 s of inhalation and 5 s of exhalation per breath). A continuous ECG will be recorded, with marker to indicate the onset of each inspiration and expiration. Maximum and minimum R-R intervals will be measured during each breathing cycle and converted into beats per minute

- b. Heart rate response to Valsalva maneuver: Subjects will be asked to blow into a mouthpiece connected to a mercury manometer and hold it at a pressure of 40 mmHg for 15 seconds, simultaneously monitored by the ECG. The ECG will be continued to be recorded 15 seconds after the release of pressure
- c. Response of blood pressure to standing: The patient changes from the lying to the standing position while a continuous ECG (lead II) is recorded.
- d. Response of blood pressure to sustained hand grip: Using a hand grip dynamometer, a maximum voluntary contraction is first determined and then maintained at 30% of that maximum for as long as possible. The blood pressure is measured before and at 1- minute intervals during hand grip.

Respiratory system:

Baseline BP will be monitored, subject will be asked to hyperventilate for 30sec and simultaneously HR and blood pressure will be monitored

Pupils:

A normal pupillary light response needs both the autonomic arms intact. The Neurological Pupil index will be calculated by the Pupillometer



Critically however, prior experimental research exploring the memory benefits of napping has only examined napping as a supplement to a fixed amount of nocturnal sleep.(11–15),(17–19) As such, nap conditions were associated with more total sleep in the 24 h period prior to cognitive tests compared to wake conditions that did not include a nap. Enhanced post-nap cognition could therefore be a function of total sleep obtained, rather than the nap per se. Determining if naps can benefit learning and memory when total sleep duration is held constant is crucial, as it could inform whether educational institutions should make the considerable practical adjustments that would facilitate napping in schools, or whether alternate solutions that focus on nocturnal sleep would provide similar benefits.

It remains to be determined how long-term memory is affected when learning takes place under a similar split sleep schedule. To address these gaps in our knowledge, we compared long term memory in adolescents who learned across two simulated weeks of restricted sleep in a naturalistic school setting, where sleep opportunities on each day were either split into 5 h nocturnal sleep and a 1.5 h daytime nap, or 6.5 h of continuous nocturnal sleep.

- Effect of sleep restriction on picture encoding [Time Frame: Single session during the 15-day protocol, after recovery night 2 (second recovery period)]

7.3 Review of Literature

The effects of sleep deprivation on performance have been assessed both by examination of particular working situations and by measurement of task performance in healthy research subjects(1). The length of sleep deprivation is thought to be crucial with decrements in performance being more easily demonstrable after continuous sleep deprivation for 37 h. Performance on tasks which are interesting is less sensitive to sleep deprivation (1). A recent meta-analysis revealed that sleep deprivation does indeed adversely affect both accuracy and response time during working memory tasks, with effect sizes generally in the moderate range (2). Some of the most essential cognitive capacities to survival include the ability to acquire new information, commit such information to long-term storage, and effectively retrieve that information when needed – in other words, learning and memory. A large and growing literature suggests that sleep is critical to learning and memory, and when sleep is hindered, memory processing is correspondingly degraded (3). As we know, SD induces a wide-range of negative effects on cognitive functions (4,5). Previous studies have shown that memory and mood state are highly affected following SD (6,7,8).



"THE MAASTRICHT ACUTE STRESS TEST (MAST): PHYSIOLOGICAL AND SUBJECTIVE RESPONSES IN ANTICIPATION, STRESS AND POST-STRESS PHASE."

7. 7.1 Introduction and Need for the study:

The human stress response plays a vital adaptive role in daily life, serving to either benefit or produce maladaptive outcomes for the individual. This response primarily encompasses physiology, perception, emotion, and behavior, which collectively interact to shape how individuals cope with and react to stressors (1). Acute stress activates two axes—the sympatho-adrenal-medullary (SAM) axis and the hypothalamic-pituitary-adrenal (HPA) axis. The former gives rise to the fight or flight response, which in turn directly affects arousal, alertness, blood pressure, heart rate, pulse rate, cardiac output, respiratory rate and salivation, while the latter has a role in release of glucocorticoids (i.e. cortisol) (1) (3). These axes are

mainly activated by physical stressors (pain, temperature) while psychosocial stressors are processed via the prefrontal cortex and the limbic system, but also affect these axes (1) (2).

The Maastricht Acute Stress Test (MAST) employs a combination of physical and psychological stress via the well-known Cold Pressor Test (CPT) and the Trier Social Stress Test (TSST) respectively. Both types of stress show variations in response in different individuals, especially when anticipatory stress is taken into consideration. These tests are designed to mimic real-life situations of acute stress (public speaking, singing) (1) (4). Emotional stress via the International Affective Picture System (IAPS) can be scored by the Self-Assessment Manikin (SAM).

The target populations of this study are the competitive athletes compared to the non-athletic population. This is one of very few attempts made to assess the effect of MAST on such a population. The MAST allows researchers to induce acute stress in a controlled setting and by using a consistent pattern of stressors across participants, it ensures that the stress response is comparable and can be studied systematically. Its standardized nature makes it highly reproducible, allowing researchers to replicate the stress induction process in different studies and settings, including the athletic population. This could enable researchers to study differences in stress reactivity in such people and can help gain insights on how to manage the mental and emotional state of competitive athletes, especially when they are faced with failure or physical injuries. This way, coaches and sports psychologists can better understand the factors influencing resilience or vulnerability to stress, and train and guide such a population accordingly. It can also be used to study the stress response in clinical populations, such as individuals with anxiety, depression or post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). Researchers can use the MAST to assess the efficacy of stress-reducing interventions or therapeutic strategies. The MAST is not only a research tool but also a valuable teaching and training resource. It can be used to educate students, clinicians, and researchers about stress responses, stress assessment, and stress-related disorders.

This study aims to elicit robust stress reactions to study and quantify various aspects of the stress response, including physiological, psychological, and behavioural changes, in order to provide better mental, emotional and psychological care as healthcare providers, especially to the overlooked competitively athletic population.

7.2 Objective of the study

- 1. **Primary Objectives:** To evaluate the physiological response to an acute psychological stressor using the MAST and an emotional stressor and compare the responses of competitively athletic individuals and non-athletic individuals.
- **2. Secondary Objectives:** To assess the subjective stress response by using the following paradigms:
 - i) State-Trait Anxiety Inventory
 - ii) Depression Anxiety Stress Scales

7.3 Review of Literature

Physical fitness has always been directly connected to athletic performance but the link between psychological well-being and athletic performance is also undeniable. Psychological stress can significantly impact an athlete's ability to perform at their best. Stress can manifest as anxiety, nervousness, or fear of failure, leading to a decline in focus, coordination, and decision-making abilities. ⁽⁷⁾ It can even contribute to physical fatigue and increased risk of injury. In competition anxiety, mainly state anxiety is affected but it later converts to trait anxiety. This could negatively affect the performance of the athlete. ⁽⁵⁾ (6) This is why trait dominance is used to develop personalized coping mechanisms. ⁽⁷⁾

To address this, two essential assessments have been incorporated into our research study: the Maastricht Acute Stress Test (MAST) and the International Affective Picture System (IAPS) test.

The Maastricht Acute Stress Test (MAST) combines physical and psychological stress by utilizing the well-known Cold Pressor Test (CPT) and the Trier Social Stress Test (TSST). Both types of stress produce diverse responses in various people, especially when anticipatory stress is included. These exercises are intended to simulate real-life stressful situations (public speaking, singing) (1) (4). The Self-Assessment Manikin (SAM) can assess emotional stress using the International Affective Picture System (IAPS).

The MAST test helps us understand an athlete's level of stress resilience and reactivity by subjecting them to controlled stressors in a research setting. This is one of very few attempts made to assess the effect of MAST on the athletic population. This valuable insight allows us to tailor support systems and coping strategies to build mental toughness and confidence. It also provides a way to assess how athletes might perform under pressure during competitions.

On the other hand, the IAPS test enables us to gauge emotional responses to various stimuli. An athlete's control over their emotion can predict the successfulness of his/her performance. (7) (8) Understanding an athlete's emotional reactivity helps coaches design training sessions that consider their mental state, promoting a more positive and focused approach to preparation and competition.

By integrating these psychological assessments into coaching methodology, coaches and guides can equip our athletes with the tools to overcome stress and perform optimally. Mental training techniques, such as visualization, mindfulness, and goal-setting, will complement physical training, fostering a harmonious balance between body and mind. ⁽⁷⁾

8. Materials and Methods

8.1 Source of Data: Participants indulging in competitive cricket aged between 14-20 years.

8.2 Study Design: Experimental Study

8.3 Study Period: 3 months

8.4 Sample Size: Total of 60 participants with 30 in each group

- (a) Males aged between 14-20 years, indulging in competitive cricket for minimum 6 months.
- (b) Competitive athletes who are training for at least 3 days a week.

8.7 Exclusion Criteria:

- (a) Those who have a history of childhood trauma, PTSD or depression.
- (b) Those who suffer from diabetes mellitus and heart disease.

8.8 Study protocol: Consort flow chart for RCTs

8.9 Data collection procedure:

- (I) Participants will be asked to arrive at 6.00 pm at the venue and the test will be started at sharp 7.00 pm to maintain a uniform hormonal circadian rhythm. They will be informed prior to the test that they should not consume alcohol/caffeine or smoke for 24 hours before the test, and no food or water should be consumed at least 30 minutes before the test. Participants will be asked to fill the voluntary written informed consent and the entire experimental protocol will be explained to them. Participants are asked to fill both STAI and DASS-21 questionnaires. Basal readings of blood pressure, heart rate, pulse rate, respiratory rate and cardiac output are taken.
- (II) This study involves the formation of an experimental group who will undergo the MAST and a non-experimental group who will undergo a no-stress placebo version of the MAST with little temperature variation in CPT, simplified counting, and no performance evaluation.

(III) For the experimental group:

The MAST begins with a 5 min preparation phase to allow the participant to read the instructions for the upcoming task (on a PowerPoint presentation). The blood pressure, heart rate, pulse rate, respiratory rate and cardiac output are measured again in the anticipatory phase. In the following 10 min acute stress phase, physical stress (e.g., cold induced pain) is combined with unpredictability, uncontrollability, and social evaluation in a mental arithmetic task. Participants will be informed that there will be alternating trials of immersing their hand into ice-cold water (maintained at 2°C), and engaging in a mental arithmetic task (counting aloud backward from 2043 in steps of 17). They will be told that the duration of these trials will be randomly chosen by the computer to last between 45 and 90 s and to use their non-dominant hand. In between the hand immersion trials, participants will resume the counting task while they rest their arm on a towel beside the water bath. If they make a mistake in accuracy or do not give a response within 5 s, negative feedback will be given by the experimenter and the participant will have to start again at 2043. Participants will also be informed that they will be video and audio recorded so as to later analyze their facial expressions and tone. In reality, the duration of all trials will be pre-determined with the same protocol used for all participants. Five hand immersion trials (HI) will be alternated with four mental arithmetic trials (MA) in the following order and length,

HI (90 s), MA (45 s), HI (60s), MA (60s), HI (60s), MA (90s), HI (90s), MA (45s), HI (60 s).

Participants will be unaware of the number of trials and the total duration of the stress phase. At a particular time during the acute stress phase, the reading of salivary cortisol will be recorded.

After the MAST, the emotional stressor (International Affective Picture System with rating via Self-Assessment Manikin) will be given in a soundproof room with a laptop. The subject will be seated in a comfortable chair and the protocol will be explained to them. The laptop will show a PowerPoint presentation with 21 shuffled images of Paul Ekman's facial expressions for the seven basic emotions (happiness, anger, disgust, sadness, contempt, surprise and fear). First there will be a baseline period for 30s, where the subject will have to close their eyes while maintaining silence. Then a 2s warning will be given after which the image will be displayed for 6s. The subject will be asked to rate the picture according to the SAM (valence, arousal and dominance) in 15s. There will be a resting period for 30s before the next image in which the subject will again have to close their eyes and maintain silence. This will be repeated for all 21 images. During this procedure blood pressure, heart rate, pulse rate, respiratory rate and cardiac output will be measured.

For the non-experimental group:

Here the MAST will begin at the same time at the same venue. Basal readings and anticipatory phase readings of blood pressure, heart rate, pulse rate, respiratory rate and cardiac output will be taken. There will again be alternating trials of mental arithmetic and physical stress phases, but markedly less stressful than the experimental group. There will be a 5 degree change from normal body temperature in the water. Participants will be asked to do simplified upward consecutive counting from 1 to 25. Even if they answer incorrectly or cannot answer within 5 seconds, no negative feedback will be given by the experimenter. The same parameters along with salivary cortisol will be measured during the stressful phase as well. Following this, the emotional stressor is administered and once again these parameters will be measured.

(V) All participants will complete only the state questionnaire of the STAI again immediately after undergoing the MAST and the emotional stressor.

8.10 Data processing and analysis/statistical analysis:

a) Testing of the salivary cortisol content during the experiment, which is a biomarker for acute stress in both experimental and non-experimental groups.

- c) State-Trait Anxiety Inventory—

It was developed by Charles D. Spielberger, Richard L. Gorsuch, and Robert E. Lushene in the late 1960s. The STAI consists of two separate scales, each comprising 20 items:

State Anxiety Scale (STAI-S):

The State Anxiety Scale assesses an individual's current, temporary emotional state of anxiety at a particular moment in time. It measures how a person feels "right now," reflecting their feelings of apprehension, tension, nervousness, and worry at the moment of completing the questionnaire. The responses are based on a 4-point Likert-type scale ranging from 1 (Not at all) to 4 (Very much so).

Trait Anxiety Scale (STAI-T):

The Trait Anxiety Scale assesses an individual's general propensity to experience anxiety as a stable personality trait over time. It measures how a person typically feels, regardless of the current situation, indicating their relatively stable and enduring anxiety levels. Like the State Anxiety Scale, responses are based on a 4-point Likert-type scale ranging from 1 (Almost never) to 4 (Almost always).

Scoring and Interpretation:

The total score for each scale (STAI-S and STAI-T) is calculated by summing the responses to the respective 20 items. Higher scores on the STAI-S indicate higher levels of current state anxiety, while higher scores on the STAI-T suggest a higher disposition towards experiencing trait anxiety.

d) Depression Anxiety Stress Scale 21

The Depression Anxiety Stress Scale 21 (DASS-21) is a widely used psychological self-assessment tool designed to measure the severity of symptoms related to depression, anxiety, and stress. It is a shorter version of the original DASS, which has 42 items, and was developed by researchers Lovibond and Lovibond in 1995.

The DASS-21 consists of three subscales, each comprising seven items, and is scored on a 4-point Likert-type scale.

Depression Scale:

The depression scale of DASS-21 assesses the presence and severity of symptoms related to depression. It includes items that measure low mood, lack of interest or pleasure in activities, and feelings of hopelessness or worthlessness, among others. Participants are asked to rate how much each statement applies to them over the past week, ranging from 0 (Did not apply to me at all) to 3 (Applied to me very much or most of the time).

Anxiety Scale:

The anxiety scale of DASS-21 assesses the presence and severity of symptoms related to anxiety. It includes items that measure feelings of nervousness, fear, restlessness, and other physical and psychological symptoms of anxiety. Participants are asked to rate how much each statement applies to them over the past week, using the same 4-point Likert scale.

Stress Scale:

The stress scale of DASS-21 assesses the presence and severity of symptoms related to stress. It includes items that measure feelings of tension, irritability, difficulty relaxing, and other stress-

related symptoms. Participants are asked to rate how much each statement applies to them over the past week, using the same 4-point Likert scale.

Scoring and Interpretation:

Each item in the DASS-21 is scored from 0 to 3, with higher scores indicating greater symptom severity. The scores from each subscale are summed to obtain a total score for depression, anxiety, and stress separately. The possible range of scores for each subscale is 0 to 21.

Interpretation of the scores is as follows:

0-4: Normal

5-6: Mild

7-10: Moderate

11-13: Severe

14+: Extremely severe

e) International Affective Picture System:

It is a standardized set of images that are widely used in research to elicit emotional responses from participants. These images represent various emotional categories, such as happiness, fear, sadness, disgust, and so on. Researchers use the IAPS to study emotional processing, emotional responses, and other related phenomena. Participants are typically shown these images and then asked to rate their emotional experiences in response to each image according to the Self-Assessment Manikin (SAM). It is a pictorial rating scale designed to measure subjective emotional experiences. Both the IAPS and SAM are developed by Dr. Richard J. Davidson and his colleagues at the Center for Investigating Healthy Minds.

The Self-Assessment Manikin typically consists of three pictorial scales, each representing a different dimension of emotional experience:

Affective Valence: This scale measures the pleasure or displeasure of the emotional experience. It ranges from a smiling, happy figure on one end to a frowning, unhappy figure on the other end.

Arousal: This scale assesses the level of physiological and psychological activation or arousal associated with the emotional experience. It ranges from a relaxed, calm figure on one end to an excited, highly aroused figure on the other end.

Dominance: This scale gauges the perceived level of control or dominance experienced during the emotional state. It ranges from a submissive, powerless figure on one end to a dominant, incontrol figure on the other end.

Participants are asked to choose the manikin that best represents their emotional state in response to a given stimulus or situation.

Introduction: The Maastricht Acute Stress Test will be done on competitively athletic cricket players to induce a combination of acute psychological and physical stress in order to assess the measurable effects of stress on the body. We will also be adding an emotional stressor to this study.

Explanation of procedure:

- (I) Participants will be asked to arrive at 9.00 am at the venue and the test will be started at sharp 10.00 am to maintain a uniform hormonal circadian rhythm. They will be informed prior to the test that they should not consume alcohol/caffeine or smoke for 24 hours before the test, and no food should be consumed 30 minutes before the test. Participants will be asked to fill the voluntary written informed consent and the entire experimental protocol will be explained to them. Participants are asked to fill both STAI and DASS-21 questionnaires. Basal readings of blood pressure, heart rate, pulse rate, respiratory rate and cardiac output are taken.
- (II) This study involves the formation of an experimental group who will undergo the MAST and a non-experimental group who will undergo a no-stress placebo version of the MAST with little temperature variation in CPT, simplified counting, and no performance evaluation.

(III) For the experimental group:

The MAST will begin with a 5 min preparation phase to allow the participant to read the instructions for the upcoming task (on a PowerPoint presentation). The blood pressure, heart rate, pulse rate, respiratory rate and cardiac output will be measured again in the anticipatory phase. In the following 10 min acute stress phase, physical stress (e.g., cold induced pain) will be combined with unpredictability, uncontrollability, and social evaluation in a mental arithmetic task. Participants will be informed that there will be alternating trials of immersing their hand into ice-cold water (maintained at 2°C), and engaging in a mental arithmetic task (counting aloud backward from 2043 in steps of 17). They will be told that the duration of these trials will be randomly chosen by the computer to last between 45 and 90 s and to use their non-dominant hand. In between the hand immersion trials, participants will resume the counting task while they rest their arm on a towel beside the water bath. If they make a mistake in accuracy or do not give a response within 5 s, negative feedback will be given by the experimenter and the participant will have to start again at 2043. Participants will also be informed that they will be video and audio recorded so as to later analyze their facial expressions and tone. In reality, the duration of all trials will be pre-determined with the same protocol used for all participants. Five hand immersion trials (HI) will be alternated with four mental arithmetic trials (MA) in the following order and length,

HI (90 s), MA (45 s), HI (60s), MA (60s), HI (60s), MA (90s), HI (90s), MA (45s), HI (60 s).

Participants will be unaware of the number of trials and the total duration of the stress phase. At a particular time during the acute stress phase, the reading of salivary cortisol will be recorded.

After the MAST, the emotional stressor (International Affective Picture System with rating via Self-Assessment Manikin) will be given in a soundproof room with a laptop. The subject will be seated in a comfortable chair and the protocol is explained to them. The laptop will show a PowerPoint presentation with 21 shuffled images of Paul Ekman's facial expressions for the seven basic emotions (happiness, anger, disgust, sadness, contempt, surprise and fear). First there will be a baseline period for 30s, where the subject will have to close their eyes while maintaining silence. Then a 2s warning will be given after which the image will be displayed for 6s. The subject will be asked to rate the picture according the SAM (valence, arousal and dominance) in 15s. There will be a resting period for 30s before the next image in which the subject will again have to close their eyes and maintain silence. This will be repeated for all 21 images. During this procedure blood pressure, heart rate, pulse rate, respiratory rate and cardiac output will be measured.

For the non-experimental group:

Here the MAST will begin at the same time at the same venue. Basal readings and anticipatory phase readings of blood pressure, heart rate, pulse rate, respiratory rate and cardiac output will be taken. There will again be alternating trials of mental arithmetic and physical stress phases, but markedly less stressful than the experimental group. There will be a 5 degree change from normal body temperature in the water. Participants will be asked to do simplified upward consecutive counting from 1 to 25. Even if they answer incorrectly or cannot answer within 5 seconds, no negative feedback will be given by the experimenter. The same parameters will be measured during the stressful phase as well. Following this, the emotional stressor is administered and once again these parameters will be measured.

(V) All participants will complete only the state questionnaire of the STAI again immediately after undergoing the MAST and the emotional stressor.

Withdrawal from participation in the study: Participation in this study in voluntary. You will be free to decide whether to participate in this study or continue participation once enrolled. 




