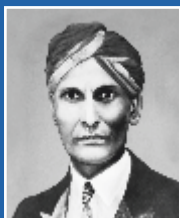

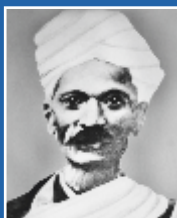

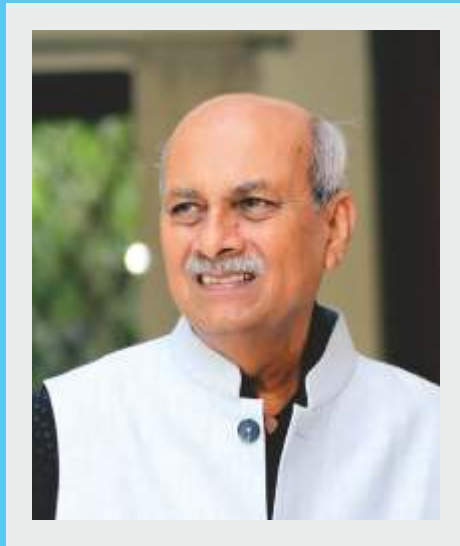

It also ensures implementation and continuous improvement by active and constructive inputs from various stakeholders to reinforce a culture of excellence in academics and administration.

For the effective deployment of the strategic plan, the leadership provides adequate human as well as financial resources, makes a periodic review and monitors its implementation.

The leadership at KAHER is proactive. It is responsive to the current needs of all stakeholders and has a futuristic vision for growth and development. There is an awareness regarding contemporary best practices in higher education, particularly, education in health sciences. Thus, KAHER ensures holistic and all-round development of students.

Long Term Vision

Marching ahead from 'Vision 2020', KAHER has framed 'Vision 2030' document, a 10 years rolling plan and a 5 year strategic plan that will serve as a road-map for its further development. The 2030 vision will be demarcating development under three stages namely, immediate goals, mid-term and long term goals.

At regular intervals the vision document is visited to monitor and analyze the progress and achievements. KAHER has fulfilled 95% of its objectives stated in the 'Vision 2020' document. The unfulfilled goals have been critically reviewed. Feedback from all stakeholders and administrators has helped in redefining the goals to make them achievable.

KAHER continues to build on its goals and commitments towards research, teaching-learning, infrastructure, use of ICT and advancement in patient care. Accordingly, the University has planned, prioritized and phased what is to be achieved over a period of 5 and 10 years (2021-2030).

The Vision:

- Is aligned to the core values of the organization
- Is in tune with National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 - Newer paradigms in Education
- Incorporates - Professionalism, Human values, Ethics and 21st Century Skills
- Includes flexible curricula with Inter-professional linkages
- Explores newer frontiers of research in basic sciences and emerging areas
- Integrates technology in programs and services

For the ease of implementation the action plan is divided into the following segments.

1. Vision with Values

The University is committed to establishing a Culture of quality with an incessant Quest for knowledge through the Spirit of enquiry. Instilling a culture of discipline along with innovation through out of box thinking and ensuring accountability and responsibility are the key areas of focus.

2. Academic Culture

The academic culture of the University will be guided by the principles enunciated in the National Education Policy 2020 and will seek to incorporate and promote Competency Based Medical Education and Competency Based Nursing Education in the faculties of Medicine and Nursing. The faculties of Dentistry, Pharmacy and Physiotherapy will integrate Outcome Based Education in their curricula. The faculties of Ayurveda and Homeopathy will also seek to adapt their curricula to the needs of the changing times.

The teaching-learning methodologies will incorporate Innovative student centric T-L practices, Technology in education and Humanities in Health Professions Education. The University will endeavor to develop dual degree programs and establish twinning programs and student and faculty exchange programs with international and national universities of repute.

KLE Academy of Higher Education and Research is uniquely positioned to evolve a Holistic and multidisciplinary approach. Apart from KLE Technological University, KLE Society has a number of Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) from Liberal Arts to Basic Sciences to Law and Management, many of them enjoying autonomous status from UGC. KAHER will harness this enormous potential to develop Inter-disciplinary, Multi-disciplinary and Inter-professional educational and research programs.

The University will utilize the academic flexibility and provide opportunities for students to choose and chart one's their own course of learning by providing Vertical and horizontal mobility, Multiple entry and exit points and Lateral Entry. The University will adopt the system of Credit transfer and credit bank for the aforesaid courses with Research and Teaching Intensive Universities.

Within the framework of the autonomy provided by the regulatory bodies, the University will introduce innovative courses focused on developing life skills such as- Leadership, team work and communication skills, Critical thinking and decision making, Professionalism and ethics, Change management and change control.

The examination system will be reformed by introducing innovations in student assessment with a focus on frequent and formative assessments

Through collaborative efforts with private philanthropic entities, the university will create equal opportunities for all. There will be an emphasis on self-disclosure.

The university will initiate measures to attract foreign students

3. Infrastructure - Technology

There will be greater emphasis on equity and access, development of e-resources and e-content, increasing use of Virtual/simulation labs and data centres and enhancing ICT facilities for teaching-learning, research and other support services along with the establishment of a completely digitalized library. The University will also fully implement e-governance for administration.

There will more focus on inter-disciplinary research with technological institutes.

The University will continue to upgrade the services and infrastructure of the Hospital consonant with the technological advances in diagnostics and therapeutics.

The Green initiatives on the campus will be further augmented by enhancing the usage of renewable energy sources.

4. Research

The university will continue its efforts towards emerging as a leading research university. For fulfilling this objective, the university shall develop a corpus fund for research. By nurturing the existing collaboration with National Institute of Traditional Medicine of ICMR, Belagavi and capitalizing on the rich repository of traditional medicine plants located in the biodiversity hotspot of the Western Ghats, the University will seek to research and develop alternative therapies of Indian traditional systems of medicine.

Simultaneously, the university will also promote research in the fields of Genomics, Nano medicine, biomarkers, micro nutrients as well as a variety of Communicable and Non Communicable diseases including emerging viral diseases. The university will augment its Basic Science Research Centres with advanced techniques of Tissue Culture and Immunoassays and develop Cell Repositories.

5. Human Resources and Faculty development:

Human resources remain the greatest asset of any organization. The university shall upgrade faculty knowledge and skills to meet contemporary and advanced needs through continuous professional development programs in collaboration with national and international institutes of repute. Training and encouraging faculty involvement in quality research will continue to be a point of focus

6. Student support and progression:

The university shall continue to promote gender equity and inclusiveness, provide scholarships and free-ships to deserving students, facilitate skill enhancement through value added courses and promote participation in co- and extra-curricular activities

7. Community Engagement

Engaging communities through the development of Public-Private-Partnership models is an essential prerequisite for the successful translation of research to policy to practice. The university shall accomplish the same through the adoption of villages and schools. Outreach activities like health checkup camps, awareness campaigns and screening programs for the rural unreached population will be prioritized.

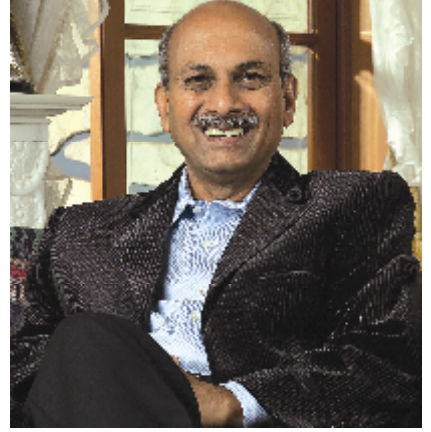

The University Department of Education for Health Professional (UDEHP) was established in November 2007 to enhance professional competencies. 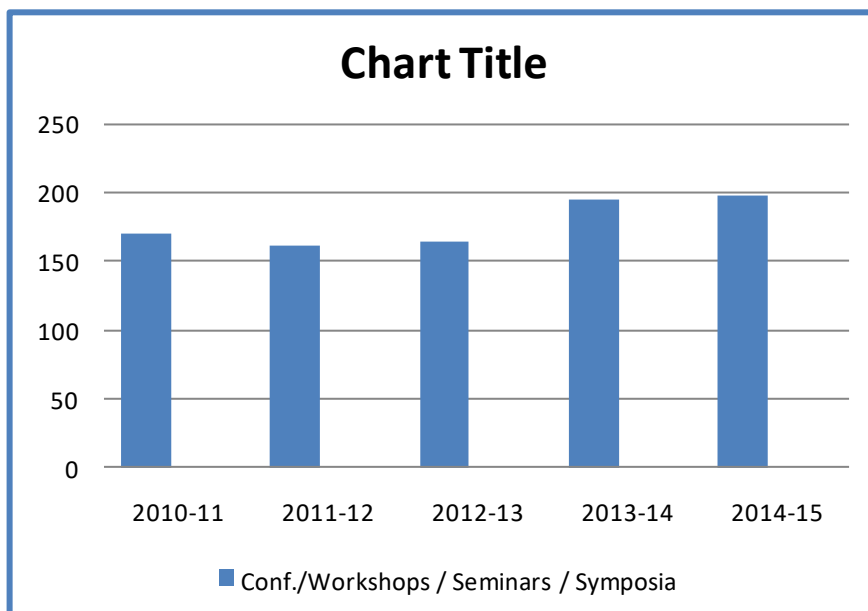

- **Master Plan for New Campus of the University- Conceptualization and Execution**
- Ultramodern new campus with hi-tech facilities shall be developed on approximately 100 Acres of land in the vicinity of Belgaum for administrative and academic activities of the University. The construction of structures of Administrative Block, Examination Hall, Academic Hall, Teaching Block, Research Wing, Library, V.C. Lodge, Staff Quarters (teaching and non-teaching), Guest House, Reception Centre, Computer Centre, three Seminar Halls, Auditorium, Indoor-Complex, Canteen, Post Office and Bank, Cooperative Store, Hostels for boys and girls, etc.

- The University has state of art facilities for an efficient e- governance, adopting a paperless concept and better connectivity

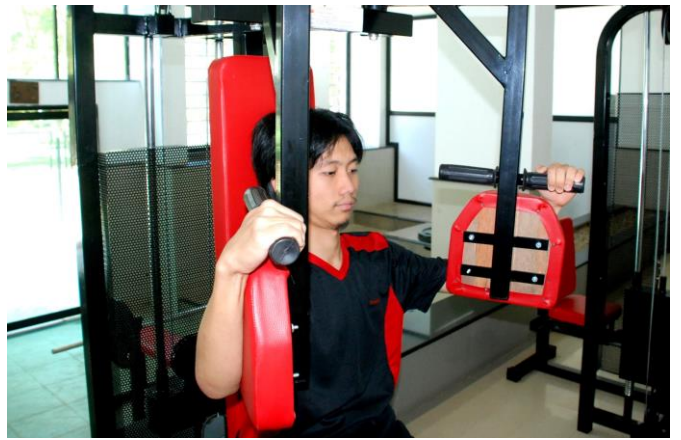
➤ **Clean and green new campus with plantation of economical, medicinal and aromatic plants. Establishment of eco-friendly campus with excellent water and energy management**

Academic, administrative and financial autonomy to allow Departments to initiate self-financing programmes.**

- The University under its able leadership of Chancellor and Vice-Chancellor has created an environment of approval and security has been created in which all employees feel free to express themselves.

- The leader ensures implementation and continuous improvement by active and constructive inputs from various stakeholders to reinforce culture of excellence.
- The Vice-Chancellor is the academic and executive officer of the University and he is overall responsible for the working of the University and is accountable to the Chancellor through the Board of Management.
- Various Statutory Bodies of the University function under strict supervision of Hon. Vice-Chancellor and Registrar.
- As an academic head of the University, the Vice-Chancellor, co-ordinates with the Principals of the constituent units and Heads of the Departments, faculty members and the students on academic issues. The Calendar of Events prepared for the University is closely monitored by the Vice-Chancellor.
- As an executive officer, the Vice-Chancellor is responsible for internal coordination and monitoring and also interacts with and instructs the Registrar, Controller of Examinations, Finance Officer, Principals and, non-teaching staff on administrative issues. He ensures smooth conduct of all University examinations and timely declaration of results.
- As the Head of the institution, the Vice-Chancellor presides over the meetings of Board of Management, Academic Council, Board of Examinations, Finance Committee, Planning and Monitoring Board, Board of University Teaching and Research. The Vice-Chancellor also interacts with statutory and regulatory bodies and provides the academic leadership to the University.

 - Medical Exhibition: on the eve of Suvarna Sambhrama 2013, No of beneficiaries-37,738
- The Institute of Dental Sciences in the year 2010-2011, conducted District Oral Health Mission in which 85,558 school children belonging to 888 Government primary schools were screened and 14,887 children were treated for various dental problems. A mega camp was organized at 21 centres on the eve of World No Tobacco Day wherein, 3,299 patients were screened, counseled and provided free dental treatment.
- On the eve of golden jubilee celebration of J.N. Medical College in the year 2013, 12 mega camps were organized on Sundays for the benefit of the rural community. A total of 33,088 patients were benefitted.
- Apart from these, routine camps were held by faculty of Medical College, through which 63,000 patients were benefitted.
- The Institute of Nursing conducts lactation clinic on every Friday and breast self examination on every Tuesday for patients in the hospital.

- The Institute of Physiotherapy conducts monthly camps to outreach rural population.
 - The Red Cross Wing of the University along with the constituent units conducted rallies, and 56 blood donation camps, where 1262 units of blood have been collected.

 - The valuable suggestions and feedback gathered at alumni meets are utilized to implement constructive changes in the institute.
 - The alumni have contributed to the development of institution by providing funds, books, instruments, instituting gold medal award for highest marks in different specialties, establishment of faculty recreation club, organizing interaction of alumni entrepreneurs with student aspirants and helped their professional colleagues who are in need financially and emotionally by collecting funds, motivating and interacting with them.
 - The alumni share their expertise and skills by giving guest lectures and conducting workshops during the alumni meet.
 - The number of alumni registered as members in the alumni association of the constituent units has increased progressively. Till date more than 5543 alumni are registered.
 - Institutions have made great effort in establishing good and fair relationships between the existing students and the alumni to support the students for research, job placement, higher education, etc.
 - Distinguished alumni are felicitated during the alumni meets to honor their contributions and services to the society.
 - The alumni directory is updated.
 - Alumni are also involved in conduct of social awareness programs like, blood donation and free health check-up camps.

- There has been marked increase in the number of consultancies provided by the faculty and the institutions in terms of academics, research and health care services.
- In last five years, Rs. 24,78,95609.90/- has been generated through consultancy services.
- Consultancy services have benefited all the stakeholders. It has enhanced exposure, knowledge and skill of students and faculty. It has also helped faculty in terms of development of expertise, experience and revenue

➤ **World-class quality education, research, infrastructure, and entrepreneurship. International academic standards using State-of-the-Art technology, distinguished faculty and ultra-modern and eco-friendly campus.**

- The University has been giving importance to innovations in teaching-learning processes, which have made learning effective and enjoyable. It helped students to develop deeper learning competencies.
- Information and Communication Technologies (ICT) are integrated by way of networking, access to internet, virtual library resources, e-learning and development of e-content and computer-based trainings in order to meet the technologically driven global needs.
- The institutions continue to be equipped with the ICT-based devices to make learning a vibrant experience.
- Reflective learning by hands-on training and experiments enhances the personal learning abilities of the students.
- Teaching on simulators in medicine, dentistry, physiotherapy and nursing has enhanced the skill of students to a great extent. Treatment and assessment techniques like electrotherapy, manual therapy and exercise therapies, ALS, BLS, PALS and HBB skills, as well as, ICU management techniques are taught on mannequins.
- Emphasis is laid on development of required skills, adequate knowledge dissemination and appropriate attitude development to practice medicine.
- Learning is made more active and self-directed by giving the students newer and challenging topics for seminars and article presentations.
- Student-assisted teaching is done through small group activity, seminars, journal clubs, tutorials, etc.
- The e-learning also provides the choice of interactive tutorial module. They can also take self assessment test available on the e-learning module. The central library has an audio-visual section archiving CDs and cassettes on various topics. Many departments maintain a set of CDs and DVDs related to their speciality.
- Tutorials are part of academic schedule and are conducted in each subject. It consists of concept clarification and better understanding of the subject. Previous examination question papers and model question papers are discussed and solved in the class rooms. The students are trained in writing the answers.
- The faculty members are trained in EBM in an International Workshop organized by the college in collaboration with University of Illinois, Chicago, USA. PG students are sensitized to EBM during PG orientation programme which is conducted every year for fresh batch of PG students.
- Integrated teaching modules are introduced and practiced.
- Pharmacokinetics and pharmaco-vigilance facilities are provided in the hospitals of the University.
- Clinical skills Laboratory teaching is an integral component of teaching methodology practiced in the constituent units.

- All the clinical department libraries have video CDs on various types of diseases and rare clinical cases in the archives, which can be retrieved, as and when needed. These are shown to the students for the development of the knowledge and skills. The videos are also made available to the students, patients and caretakers.
- The facility of video graphing has provided an outstanding source of learning and reference to the students, and has greatly increased their knowledge and self-confidence while dealing with patients.
- Drug Information Center at the teaching hospital is staffed by licensed graduate pharmacists and postgraduate students of Pharmacy Practice who have specialized training in drug information.
- Libraries have E-learning resources like e-database, e-books, e-journals ICT and smart class, production of teaching modules and interactive learning, MED RC Server, Helinet, Science Direct , Access to Cochrane database, INFLIBNET and “Sakshat.ac.in” through 1 GBPS lease line obtained through NMEICT. Institution has various software computing facilities like WINDOWS XP, WINDOWS 7, MS OFFICE 2007, MS OFFICE 2010, Adobe reader, Customized Application Software for administrative purpose, Tally-ERP-9 for account section, SPSS software latest version no. 21 for research, website updation software, etc.
- The hardware computing facilities at the University are above dual core processor which includes DDR 2 and 3 and includes, more than 200 GB of hard disk with TFT / LED monitor along with network printer.
- Software used for research purpose in Research Foundation is SPSS version no.21.
- LAN facility with 40MBPS bandwidth
- Institutional Repository and KIOSK facilities are available in the central library for the benefit of faculty and students for data access.
- Automated machine (KIOSK) is situated at the entrance of the lobby to enhance quick and easy book / journals search for students.
- E-learning resources for undergraduate, postgraduate, faculties: MEdRC, HELINET facility, BMJ Case Reports and Best Practices
- Book Bank facility is available in the library.
- All the library operations are computerized by using Easylib 4.3.2/4.3.6 with SQL 2005 server. This has facilitated wider and deeper acquisition of information to improve the existing library services, to introduce new information services and to retrieve stored information easily. The libraries follow Dewey Decimal Classification Scheme for the classification of the books and accordingly, books are arranged on the book shelves. Colon classification is followed for the classification of the back volumes of journals.
- The University is part of HELINET consortium and INFLIBNET / DELNET for resource sharing.
- BMJ Case Report and Best Practices are subscribed for the benefit of

postgraduates and faculty which can be accessed on Wi-Fi in any part of the campus with IP linked user password.

- The mission statements of the University are to promote sustainable development of higher education, with upgraded infrastructure and learning resources. To also significantly increase research activity with collaborations, aid in rural health missions and above all to become 21st century model for an academic health science and service center.
- The nine-stage curriculum development pattern adopted by the University has helped it to make the curriculum relevant and contemporary.
- The curricula for all programs focus on Vision-Mission, Goals and Objectives of the University.
- The range of programs available to the learners encompasses undergraduate, postgraduate, post-doctoral degree, super-specialty, post graduate diploma, diploma, certificate and inter-disciplinary programs.
- The first concern of these programs has been to achieve highest level of effectiveness in readying students for advanced studies and jobs.
- In last four years, University has started 72 new programs apart from the existing ones.
- Regular revision of curriculum of existing programs based on relevance and needs is a distinct feature of the University. The revision has enabled scientific measurement of texts.

The University's research Foundation is **one of the eight Global Network sites across the world and considered the best site. The exemplary work has been appreciated by dignitaries like Secretary of Health & Human Services USA, Union Health Minister, Government of India and other dignitaries.**
- Smile Train project: Cleft Lip, Cleft Palate operations are outsourced to the Department of Plastic Surgery, Pediatric Surgery, Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, Orthodontics and Dentofacial Orthopaedics from Non Governmental Agency in USA. So far, the department has operated 2381 children in the last five years free of cost.
- Community Based Research on Women and Children funded from NIH, USA. So far,

the Research foundation has 17 completed Projects and 5 ongoing projects for which principal investigator / research officers have received amount for their consultancy services.

- Research foundation has also established collaborative research activities with National AIDS Research Institute (NARI), Pune, on HIV and Cervical cancer. Government Medical College, Nagpur on use of Antenatal Corticosteroid Trial (ACT) in Pre-term births and Helping Babies Breathe (HBB) trial.
- The University Research Foundation has been instrumental in establishing research units at SN Medical College, Bagalkot and B. M. Patil Medical College, Vijayapura.
- Based on the study conducted at KLEU Research Foundation, misoprostol has been included into the essential drug list of WHO and is implemented in 26 countries.
- The Navajati Shishu Suraksha Karyakram (NSSK) national programme is an outcome of “FIRST BREATH” study of the University research foundation.
- The latest news letter (WARNING) of NIH which depicts the ‘use of antenatal corticosteroids’ is an outcome of the ACT trial conducted at this University.
- The University promotes extension activities through the Department of Community Medicine, Public Health Dentistry, Public Health, Community Physiotherapy and Community Health Nursing, KLE Hospital and Research Foundation by organizing various health checkup, diagnostic, treatment, and educational camps in rural and semi urban areas where the internees and postgraduate students acquire training and also contribute to the sustainable community development.
- The ASHA and Anganwadi workers are trained through the KLE Research foundation and are the main field based workers for projects like “Maternal and Newborn Health Registry (MNH Registry)”, “Antenatal Corticosteroids Trial in Preterm Births to Increase Neonatal Survival”, “Helping Babies Breathe” project, Two strategies of misoprostol for prevention of PPH, Clindamycin for prevention of preterm labour”, The CLIP (Community Level Interventions for Pre-Eclampsia) Cluster Randomized Controlled Trial, etc.
- Letter of appreciation is received from Ms. Kathleen Sebelius, Health Secretary of United States of America for the work done by the KLE Research Foundation in the field of Women and Child Health.
- Major and minor research projects are ongoing on mother and child health through the Research Foundation of the University in association with ICMR and other International agencies.
- The Research Foundation of the University has adopted 30 PHCs for maternal and new born health (MNH) registry through which the maternal mortality rate, perinatal mortality rate, neonatal mortality rate, crude death rate, crude birth rate of the district have declined in last five years.
- Research extension activities have been extended to 4 districts (Bagalkot, Vijayapura, Belagavi & Kolar) through projects undertaken by Research Foundation sponsored by NIH, GYNUITY, WHO etc.

- The Hospital and Research Foundation over the years have established a firm foundation of **Public Private Partnership model (PPP)** to deliver health care services to community.
- Education at KLE is striving to cross national boundaries, interconnect systems on healthcare, cultural and technological grounds as a key to maximize patient care. The University has also been trying to develop educated and dedicated talents in many areas of health science.
