- Students expressed that institution provides opportunity for self-motivation, discussion and reinforcement of lessons learned.






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- They agreed that they were aware of the assessment methods and examination schedule at the beginning of the course.

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Action Taken Report

The feedback on curriculum (2021-22) by teachers was taken and analyzed.

- Teachers agreed that the content of the course includes all the topics as per the pharmacy council of India.
- They also agreed that the course content help students to acquire relevant knowledge and skills.
 80% of the teachers expressed that, the course content was subdivided into must to know, nice to know, good to know categories.
- Teachers agreed to the point that the curriculum provides scope to utilize appropriate teaching methods to emphasize the relevance of the subject.
- Teachers expressed that they have adopted wide range of teaching methods such as Lectures, Team based learning, Case based learning, Problem based learning, small group discussion, Hands on training etc. 88% of the teachers felt that there is no infrastructure or resource which is not provided by the institute.
- Teachers have implemented various innovative teaching methods such as summer research projects, E content, Problem based learning, Group discussion, Debate, Hands on training, Practice school, Team based learning, Revision and interaction session and project-based learning.
- Teachers agreed that adequate training is provided to them, in terms of curriculum implementation.
 Two teachers suggested to include industry-oriented practicals and industry job enhancing topics in the curriculum. These suggestions will be discussed in the forthcoming Board of studies meetings.


