"<u>Fund for Improvement of S&T Infrastructure in Universities and Higher</u> Educational Institutions (FIST) " GRANT.

In recent years, scientific community has expressed great concern about the lack of infrastructure facilities for imparting good quality of higher education and conducting research in emerging fields of science and engineering. Several efforts have been made in past to strengthen research as well as teaching in carefully identified areas and university departments. These departments are now in a stage for further strengthening of their infrastructure to enhance their visibility both nationally and internationally. It has also become necessary to extend such infrastructure support to other higher technical and medical educational institutions.

Keeping all these factors in mind, a new scheme entitled "Fund for Improvement of S&T Infrastructure in Universities and Higher Educational Institutions – (FIST)" has been initiated.

The Terms and Conditions:

- The grant being released under the scheme is for strengthening infrastructure of the identified department for teaching and research and shall be spent exclusively for this purpose. The Head or its nominee (to be decided by the Department/ Institute/ University) of the identified Department/ Centre shall be the "Program Coordinator for the DST-FIST".
- There should not be any deviation from the Budget Heads as approved by DST. In case, if it is very necessary, a request can be made to the DST for consideration.
- The grants-in-aid for "Networking and Computational Facilities" being released under the scheme should be utilized for creating a "Central Computer Lab" in the identified Department/ Centre for teaching and research with the following guidelines / norms:
 - a. Internet Connectivity (to be provided by Institution)
 - b. Server + Hub + Modem
 - c. Several PCs or Net-Computers proportional to number of students enrolled
 - d. UPS
 - e. Access for Students and Faculties in the Department

The Institution should also make sure that this grant is not meant for just providing PCs to each of the Faculty members in the Department.

- The grants-in-aid under "FIST" is to provide infra-structural facilities for research and teaching in the department. Therefore, no provision of Overhead Charges is admissible.
 Please note that the scheme does not allow any provision for building/construction and recruitment of staff etc.
- All the assets acquired from the grant will be the property of the Government of India and should not, without the prior sanction of the Department, be disposed off or encumbered or utilized for purposes other than those for which the grant has been sanctioned.

 to withdraw the project from the Department/ University.
- The Institute will furnish to Department of Science & Technology, Utilization Certificate and an audited Statement of Accounts (in DST format) pertaining to the grant (along with Progress Report) within three months following the end of each financial year.
- After receiving the grant by the Department/ Centre, Department of Science & Technology
 will review the technical & financial progress including utilization of the grant on an annual
 basis with an appropriate mechanism. The Department reserves the right to terminate the
 support at any stage if it is convinced that the grant has not been properly utilized or
 appropriate progress is not being made.
- A register of the permanent/semi-permanent assets acquired wholly or mainly out of this
 grant should be maintained in the prescribed form and a copy thereof furnished to this
 Department. Such register of assets and the accounts maintained shall be available or
 open to scrutiny by Audit.
- Any unspent amount sanctioned would be surrendered to the Government as a Demand Draft in favour of Drawing & Disbursing Officer, Department of Science & Technology, New Delhi. Any carry forward of funds to the next financial year may be considered only with the specific approval of the Department.
- The Comptroller and Auditor General of India, at his discretion, shall have the right to access to the book accounts for this support. It is found expedient to keep a part or whole of the grant in a bank account earning interest. The interest thus earned should be reflected appropriately in the Financial Statement of each year submitted to the Department of Science & Technology. The interest thus earned will be adjusted against further installment of the grant.
- In order to give visibility to the identified department, the department may be called as "DST-FIST Sponsored Department". This may be suitably displayed.

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

Project Approval Committee chaired by Secretary, Ministry of AYUSH met on 28th December, 2017 at 05.00 p.m. in the Ministry of AYUSH and considered the proposal of implementing pharmacovigilance program of AVUSH drugs during 2017-18 as received from the designated National Pharmacoviguance Coordination Centre (NPVCC) i.e. All India Institute of Ayurveda(AllA); New Delhi. - 2. Project manpower on contractual basis may be recruited by open mode following the codal formalities and the scheme guidelines.
- 3. Proposal for engagement of manpower for the Programme Management Unit in the Ministry of AYUSH and for organizing a National workshop in March, 2018 may be processed separately in file for approval of the IFD.
- 4. Awareness building initiatives may be taken up and in this regards initially, a press release may be given to the PIB for wider circulation in the media.
- 5. The NPvCC may send the composition of various committees as envisaged under the scheme for the approval of the Ministry.



Non-alcoholic Fatty Liver Disease (NAFLD) is the type of fatty liver which occur due to deposition of fat in liver due to cause other than excessive consumption of alcohol. As per epidemiological studies, the prevalence rate of NAFLD is around 9% to 32% of general population in India. The prevalence of getting NAFLD is higher in those with metabolic disorders like obesity and diabetes. It is more common among men than in women until age 60, because of the protective action of estrogen in women. It is also associated with insulin resistant and metabolic syndrome. Most people with NAFLD have few or no symptoms. Some patients may complain of fatigue, malaise and dull right upper quadrant abdominal discomfort. Mild jaundice may be noticed.NAFLD can lead to life threatening risks like liver failure/Liver cancer, cardiovascular diseases (cardiac arrhythmia) and also common manifestation of diseases like hypertriglyceridemia, Obesity and type II diabetes.

Ayurvedic texts mention about NAFLD like illness & the formulations for its treatment. It is worthwhile to explore the mentioned Ayurvedic formulation for any potential benefits.

NAFLD has become a major issue due to the high prevalence of metabolic disorders and risks associated with it. No specific treatment module is available till date. So, the present study has been taken up.

2. Present knowledge and relevant bibliography including full titles of articles relating to the project.

NAFLD symptoms includes, fatigue, weakness, Loss of appetite, weight loss, nausea, abdominal pain, spider like blood vessels, yellowing of skin and sclera(jaundice), itching, fluid built up, swelling of legs (oedema) and abdomen(ascites) and mental confusion, dull right upper quadrant abdominal discomfort.

These symptoms in Ayurvedic classical texts can be correlated with the features of Udara (Ajata Udaka Awastha of Yakrutddalyudara) in Cha.chi 13/35 & Su.Ni 7/14, 15, 16

- 6. The grantee Institution shall observe all financial norms and guidelines as prescribed by the AICTE/Government of India from time to time. Grantee institution must follow GFR guidelines in procuring the sanctioned items and maintain an audited record of assets acquired wholly or substantially out of the grant-in-aid and a register for assets shall be maintained by the Institute in the prescribed form i.e. GFR-19.

Recitals

- A. The Collaborating Organisations wish to participate in the Project.
- B. This Agreement covers the roles of the Administering Institution and the Collaborating Organisations in the Project including the:
 - i. Contributions and Funding Allocations to be provided;
 - ii. intellectual property arrangements; and
 - iii. conditions of the Collaborating Organisations' participation in the Project.

1. Relationship

- 1.1 This Agreement commences on the Commencement Date and continues until the Completion Date unless terminated earlier in accordance with this Agreement. The Parties may by mutual written agreement extend the Completion Date.
- 1.2 Each Collaborating Organisation acknowledges that it has read and understands the Head Agreement and any applicable Funding Rules and agrees that:
 - 1.2.1 the Collaborating Organisation will perform its obligations in accordance with this Agreement;
 - 1.2.2 the Project shall be managed by the Administering Institution; and
 - 1.2.3 the Funding shall be allocated by the Administering Institution in accordance with the Funding Allocations.

2 Project

- 2.1 Each Collaborating Organisation agrees to:
 - 2.2.1 carry out its Project Activities in a competent and diligent manner;
 - 2.2.2 make available its Specified Personnel. If any Specified Personnel become unable or unavailable to participate in the Project, the Collaborating Organisation must use its best endeavours to replace them with persons of at least equivalent experience, ability and expertise;
 - 2.2.3 ensure that its personnel and students that attend the Administering Institution's premises to perform Project Activities comply with the Administering Institution's occupational health and safety policies; comply with the directions of the Administering Institution's personnel; do not cause any obstruction or nuisance to the Administering Institution's activities; and if required by the Administering Institution sign a confidentiality agreement in favour of the Administering Institution to protect the secrecy of any Confidential Information; and
 - 2.2.4 provide reports of the Collaborating Organisation's progress with the Project Activities (Progress Report) as required by the Administering Institution. A Progress Report is to detail at a minimum any Project Intellectual Property produced and the balance of any Funding Allocations the Collaborating Organisation has not expended on the Project as at the date of the Progress Report.

3 Project Intellectual Property

3.1 The Parties agree that the ownership of all right, title and interest in the Project Intellectual Property will upon its creation vest in the Administering Institution and also the Sponsor if required by the Head Agreement.

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- 3.2 The Administering Institution will provide each Collaborating Organisations with an irrevocable, nonexclusive, world-wide, royalty free, fully paid up non-commercial licence to use, reproduce and adapt the Project Intellectual Property that it contributed to for its own purposes except to exploit the Project Intellectual Property for Commercial Purposes.
- For the avoidance of doubt, unless expressly provided for in this Agreement, a Party's ownership of any of its Background Intellectual Property that existed at the Commencement Date is not affected by providing or making available such Background Intellectual Property for the Project Activities.

4 Funding and Contributions

- 4.1 Each Collaborating Organisation must provide its Contributions at the times and the manner specified in the Application and/or the Head Agreement unless varied by item 8 of the Agreement Details.
- 4.2 The Administering Institution shall distribute to the Collaborating Organisation the Funding in accordance with the amounts and times set out in the Funding Allocations. If any Funding Allocations are linked to the achievement of a Milestone, then the linked Funding Allocations will not be distributed until the Administering Institution is satisfied that the Milestone has been achieved.
- 4.3 The Collaborating Organisations must only use the Funding Allocations they receive for the purposes of the Project.
- 4.4 Subject to clause 16, the Collaborating Organisations agree that the Funding Allocations include all costs of a Collaborating Party to provide its Project Activities including the costs of labour, plant, equipment, tools, appliances, or other property used by the Collaborating Party and all superannuation and taxes of any kind.
- 4.5 Each Collaborating Organisation must repay to the Administering Institution at its reasonable direction any Funding Allocations, which were not spent or committed in accordance with this Agreement.

5 Assets

- 5.1 Unless otherwise explicitly provided for in the Head Agreement the:
 - 5.1.1 Administering Institution shall own all assets purchased wholly or partly with Funds (Assets) and the Assets must be used and made available in accordance with the Head Agreement; and
 - 5.1.2 Collaborating Organisations must not sell, hire, mortgage or otherwise encumber any Assets made available to the Collaborating Organisations under this Agreement.

6 Protection of Confidential Information

- 6.1 A Party to this Agreement may receive or obtain Confidential Information (Recipient) of another Party to this Agreement (Disclosing Party).
- 6.2 The Recipient must protect and maintain the secrecy of Confidential Information it receives from the Disclosing Party except to the extent absolutely necessary to perform its obligations under this Agreement.

- 6.3 The obligation of the Recipient to protect Confidential Information of the Disclosing Party continues from the Commencement Date until the Confidential Information either ceases to be Confidential Information or is returned to the Disclosing Party. If the Recipient considers that it is required to disclose Confidential Information pursuant to an Obligation it must:
 - 6.3.1 promptly give notice to the Disclosing Party with full details of the Obligation and reasons why the Recipient considers that it must disclose the Confidential Information; and
 - 6.3.2 give the Disclosing Party a reasonable opportunity to challenge in a court of law or other appropriate body whether such disclosure is necessary; or whether there is an Obligation of the Recipient to make the disclosure.
- 6.4 Unless expressly permitted by the Disclosing Party, the Recipient must not:
 - 6.4.1 modify, or reproduce in any way the Confidential Information other than for the Approved Purposes;
 - 6.4.2 manufacture any product, develop any service or use any process based on the Confidential Information; and
 - 6.4.3 disclose any Confidential Information to its Third Parties to assist in the carrying out of the Approved Purposes, unless the Third Parties have signed a confidentiality agreement that protects the Confidential Information on not less stringent terms than this Agreement.
- 6.5 The Recipient acknowledges that damages may not be an adequate remedy for any breach of the Recipient of its obligations and responsibilities under clauses 6.2, 6.3 and 6.4. Consequently, in the event of an actual or threatened breach by the Recipient of the abovementioned clauses, the Disclosing Party is entitled to seek specific performance or injunctive relief as a remedy for any such breach or threatened breach, in addition to any other remedies available at law or in equity under this Agreement or independently of this Agreement.
- 6.6 Clause 6 survives the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

7 Return of Confidential Information

- 7.1 At any time upon the written Notice of the Disclosing Party to the Recipient's Authorised Officer, the Recipient must, at its own expense, immediately cease all use of the whole or part of the Disclosing Party's Confidential Information, and return or destroy as the Disclosing Party directs:
 - 7.1.1 Confidential Information in it or its Third Parties possession (including all copies of the Confidential Information); and
 - 7.1.2 any documents created by the Recipient or its officers, employees and Third Parties which were derived or created from the Confidential Information.
- 7.2 If the Recipient or its Third Parties are required under an Obligation to retain a copy of the Confidential Information, the Recipient must take all necessary steps to secure and protect the Confidential Information until it is returned to the Disclosing Party.
- 7.3 Clause 7 survives the expiration or termination of the Agreement.

8 Insurances

8.1 The Parties will maintain during this Agreement the following insurances or similar protections in the amounts prescribed:

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- 8.1.1 public liability insurance and professional indemnity insurance of \$10 million on any one claim but limited to \$20 million (AUD) in the aggregate;
- 8.1.2 personal accident insurance cover for students; and
- 8.1.3 Workers Compensation cover for their employees.
- 8.2 Upon request a Party must promptly provide proof of its insurances or protections to the requesting Party.

9 Warranties

- 9.1 Each Collaborating Organisation warrants that it:
 - 9.1.1 is properly constituted and has the rights and authority to enter into this Agreement;
 - 9.1.2 has the necessary Intellectual Property rights and procured the necessary Moral Rights consents to grant access to and the right to use its Background Intellectual Property to the other Parties or the Sponsor;
 - 9.1.3 will co-operate with the other Parties as reasonably necessary for the proper performance of the Project; and
 - 9.1.4 will perform its obligations under this Agreement to the extent that it is reasonably possible to do so to enable timely progress of the Project.

10 Publications

- 10.1 Subject to the Head Agreement:
 - 10.1.1 this Agreement shall not be interpreted to prevent or delay publication by a Party of results relating to the Project;
 - 10.1.2 each Party is entitled to publish the results of the Project provided that Confidential Information of another Party is not disclosed. The publishing Party must provide the other Parties with a copy of any publication; and
 - 10.1.3 the Parties agree that students that participate in the Project may publish the results of their Project Activities that do not include Confidential Information of another Party or the Sponsor.
- 10.2 A Party shall not publish any Paper containing or referring to any Confidential Information of the other Party (Disclosing Party) without the prior written consent of the Disclosing Party. The Parties shall negotiate in good faith for a period of no more than 30 days, using their best endeavours to resolve any requested amendments or delays by the Disclosing Party to the publication of the Paper.
- 10.3 Each Party must comply with any acknowledgement requirements of the Sponsor for the Funding or dissemination requirements of any information or data related to the Project Activities.

11 Privacy

11.1 The Administering Institution may collect Personal Information about the Collaborating Organisations officers, employees and Third Parties during this Agreement.

- 11.2 The Administering Institution may use or disclose the Personal Information that it collects for the purposes of performing, administering and managing this Agreement and will comply with its obligations under the *Privacy and Personal Information Act* 1998 (NSW).
- 11.3 If a Collaborating Organisation collects Personal Information relating to the Administering Institution's staff or students the Collaborating Organisation must only use or disclose the Personal Information as necessary to perform its obligations under this Agreement as if the Collaborating Organisation was a government agency that is required to comply with the *Privacy and Personal Information Act 1998 (NSW)*.

12 Access to Information

- 12.1 The Collaborating Organisations acknowledge that Part 3, Division 5 of the GIPA Act requires the Administering Institution to maintain a publicly available register of government contracts that records information about certain contracts between the Administering Institution and private sector bodies. Each Collaborating Organisation acknowledges that where applicable, details of this Agreement (excluding any commercial-in-confidence provisions) may be lawfully published by the Administering Institution.
- 12.2 The Collaborating Organisations must within 7 days of receiving a written Notice by the Administering Institution, provide the Administering Institution with immediate access to the information contained in records held by the Collaborating Organisations in relation to the Project to enable the Administering Institution to comply with its obligations under the GIPA Act.
- 12.3 Any failure by a Collaborating Organisation to comply with any written Notice of the Administering Institution pursuant to clause 12.2 will be a material breach of this Agreement.

13 Liability and Indemnity

- 13.1 To the extent permitted by law, the Administering Institution's total liability to the Collaborating Organisations in contract (including under an indemnity), tort (including negligence), breach of statutory duty or otherwise in respect of any loss, damage or expense arising out of, or in connection with, this Agreement shall not exceed in aggregate for all claims that arise out of or in connection with this Agreement the Funding that the Administering Institution has received from the Sponsor.
- 13.2 Each Collaborating Organisation must indemnify and hold harmless the Administering Institution against any liability, loss or damage, costs, expenses or Claims which the Administering Institution suffers, incurs or becomes liable for (including legal costs on a solicitor and client basis) to the extent it arises out of:
 - 13.2.1 a malicious or negligent act of the Collaborating Organisation or its officers, employees, students and subcontractors in connection with the Project Activities; or
 - 13.2.2 the unauthorised or unlawful use or disclosure of any of the Administering Institution's Background Intellectual Property by the Collaborating Organisation or its officers, employees, students and subcontractors.
- 13.3 A Party's liability to another Party under this Agreement shall be reduced to the extent that any loss, damage or cost arises from or is attributable to any act or omission of the other Party including their employees, students, contractors, or agents.

14 Termination

14.1 If the Sponsor fails to provide the Funding as agreed in the Head Agreement or the Head Agreement is terminated for any reason, this Agreement may be terminated by the Administering Institution with immediate effect by Notice in writing. Each Collaborating Organisation will be entitled to payment of costs and expenses from the Funding that it has incurred or committed for the Project as at the effective date of termination, which will not exceed the amount of the Funding Allocations that have been allocated to the Collaborating Organisation in item 6 of the Agreement Details.

14.2 If:

- 14.2.1 a Collaborating Organisation breaches any material term of this Agreement not capable of remedy; or
- 14.2.2 a Collaborating Organisation breaches any material term of this Agreement capable of remedy and fails to remedy the breach within the period specified in Notice requiring it to do so; or
- 14.2.3 an Insolvency Event occurs in relation to a Collaborating Organisation (whether or not notified,

then the Administering Institution:

- 14.2.4 may immediately terminate this Agreement by Notice in writing to the Collaborating Organisations; or
- 14.2.5 may only terminate the defaulting or insolvent Collaborating Organisation's involvement in the Project.
- 14.3 If this Agreement is terminated each Collaborating Organisation must:
 - 14.3.1 take all reasonable steps to mitigate its costs; and
 - 14.3.2 promptly return all property in its possession belonging to another Party, including any Confidential Information.
- 14.4 Subclauses 14.1 and 14.3 shall survive termination of the Agreement.

15 Subcontracting

Each Collaborating Organisation must not subcontract any of the Project Activities it is to perform without the permission of the Administering Institution. Subcontracting the whole or part of the Project Activities will not relieve a Collaborating Organisation from any of its obligations under this Agreement.

16 GST

If the supply of any Project Activities is a taxable supply for which GST is payable within the meaning of the GST Law, then the Administering Institution must pay any GST that is recoverable in respect of the taxable supply in addition to the cost of the Project Activities.

17 Expenses

The Administering Institution will not be responsible or liable for any costs, claims or expenses that are not covered by the Funds a Party receives. The Administering Institution will not reimburse a Collaborating Organisation for any other expenses unless the Administering Institution has approved in writing those additional expenses.

19 Notices

A Notice or any other communication is properly given if it is delivered by hand, posted, sent by fax or by e-mail to the other Party's Authorised Officer at their relevant address specified in the Agreement Schedule.

20 Entire agreement

- 20.1 This Agreement comprises the following:
 - 20.1.1 clauses 1 to 24 inclusive, the definitions and interpretations (cl 25), and the Agreement Schedule; and
 - 20.1.2 Annexures A and B (if applicable).

21 Inconsistency

To the extent that there is any inconsistency between terms and conditions of documents that comprise the Agreement, the inconsistency shall be resolved by the terms and conditions of the documents higher in the order in which they appear in clause 20.1 prevailing over any terms of lower documents.

22 Waiver

A Party's non-exercise or delay in exercise of a right, power or remedy does not prevent the exercise of that right, power or remedy by that party. A failure or delay to exercise a right or power arising from this Agreement does not amount to a waiver of that right or power.

23 Governing Law

This Agreement is governed by the laws of the State of New South Wales. The Parties irrevocably and unconditionally submit to the non-exclusive jurisdiction of the courts or tribunals exercising jurisdiction in that state.

24 Counterparts

This Agreement may be signed in counterparts by the Parties. All counterparts when taken together constitute one instrument.

25 Definitions

25.1 The following words have these meanings in this agreement:

Administering Institution means Southern Cross University whose details are set out in the Agreement Schedule.

Agreement means those documents listed in clause 20.

Agreement Details means the Agreement details at the front of this Agreement contained in the Agreement Schedule.

Agreement Schedule means the agreement schedule at the front of this Agreement.

Annexures means Annexures A and B if applicable.

Application means the application submitted to the Sponsor organisation for Funding that resulted in the Sponsor entering into the Head Agreement with the Administering Institution and/or Collaborating Organisation as the case may.

Confidential Information means any of the following information which is either disclosed by a Party under this Agreement or observed by a Party its officers, employees or Third Parties whilst performing activities associated with this Agreement:

- any financial, business, technical and all other commercially valuable information;
- information which is by its nature confidential or which is designated by the Disclosing (b) Party as Confidential to it (including during negotiations, discussions and meetings); and
- any and all information created, derived, or ascertained directly or indirectly by the (c) Recipient from the Confidential Information,

but excludes information which is:

- i. generally available in the public domain at the date of its disclosure to the Recipient;
- ii. already properly in the possession of the Recipient in written form which the Recipient can demonstrate by written record at the date of its disclosure to be available to the public from sources other than the Recipient or properly available to the Recipient from another entity or person after the date of disclosure to the Recipient;
- iii. demonstrated by the Recipient by written record to be independently developed by an employee or agent of the Recipient having no knowledge of such information the subject of the disclosure; or

Force Majeure event means anything outside a Party's reasonable control, causing that Party to be unable to perform or observe on time an obligation under this Agreement including, without limitation, fire, storm, earthquake, explosion, accident, enemy acts, war, rebellion, insurrection, terrorism, sabotage, epidemic, quarantine restriction, general strikes and power, water or other utility shortage.

Funding means the funding provided by the Sponsor to undertake the Project.

Funding Rules means any rules of the Sponsor applicable to the Project specified in Item 4 of the Agreement Details.

"Background Intellectual Property" means Intellectual Property owned or controlled by the Consortium Lead, including but not limited to Intellectual Property developed prior to or independently of an Approved Project(s), which the Consortium Lead determines, in its sole discretion, to make available for the carrying out of an Approved Project(s).

"Business Day" or "Business Days" means a weekday or weekdays on which banks are open for business in Brisbane.

"Acquittal Statement" means the income and expenditure form completed in accordance with the template published on TlQ's website.

"Confidential Information" includes all trade secrets and know-how, financial information and other commercially valuable information of whatever description and in whatever form this information is communicated (whether by electronic means, in an electronic storage device, in writing or orally) and includes the interpretation, analysis and application of general information in the public domain.

"Consortium" means the consortium identified in each Formal Advice of Funding Approval.

"Eligible Expenditure" means the expenditure on items directly related to the delivery of an Approved Project(s) and as detailed in the relevant Funding Program Guidelines.

"Eligible Project Cost" is the total project cost, less funding contributions from other sources and costs that are ineligible for funding under the Funding Program Guidelines.

"Estimated Project Commencement Date" means the date the Approved Project(s) is expected to commence as advised in writing by the Consortium Lead.

"Estimated Project Completion Date" means the date that the Approved Project(s) is expected to be completed.

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"Final Project Report" means the final project report completed in accordance with the template provided by TIQ.

"Formal Advice of Funding Approval" means a letter of offer from TiQ to the Consortium Lead:

- a) advising that the project proposed by the Consortium Lead is approved for the purposes of a Funding Program;
- b) offering the Consortium Lead the Approved Funds, subject to the terms of this Funding Deed of Agreement; and
- c) providing details of the Approved Funds under the Funding Program and, if applicable, any fast-tracked program of funding.
- "Funding Deed of Agreement" means this document and all schedules and attachments to it.
- "Funding Period" commences on the date of Formal Advice of Funding Approval and ends on 12 months (or as approved otherwise) from this date.
- "Funding Program(s)" means TIQ's Funding Program(s) under which Approved Funding has been provided.
- "Funding Program Guidelines" means the published guidelines for a Funding Program, as advised by TIQ for a funding round.
- "GST" means an amount of goods and services tax payable under the A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999 and A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax Imposition General) Act 1999 or otherwise imposed by the Commonwealth Government.
- "GST Act" means A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999 as amended, or any replacement or other relevant legislation and regulations.
- "Ineligible Expenditure" means the expenditure on items not directly related to the delivery of an Approved Project(s) and as detailed in the relevant Funding Program Guidelines.
- "Intellectual Property" includes all copyright (including any future copyright), moral rights, all rights in relation to inventions (including patent rights), plant varieties, registered and unregistered trade marks (including service marks), registered designs, confidential information (including trade secrets and know-how), circuit layouts and all other rights resulting from intellectual activity in the industrial, scientific, literary or artistic fields as a result of the use of the Approved Funding in an Approved Project(s).
- "Moral Rights" has the meaning given to that term in the Copyright Act 1968 (Commonwealth).
- "Party" or "Parties" means a party or parties to this Funding Deed of Agreement.

NO ASSURANCE OF FUNDING 3

- 3.1. This Funding Deed of Agreement does not warrant that TIQ will offer the Consortium Lead Approved Funding under the Funding Program.
- 3.2. The Consortium Lead acknowledges that receipt and retention of Approved Funds is conditional upon receipt of a Formal Advice of Funding Approval and the Consortium Lead:

- 4.1.4. The Consortium Lead must supply to TIQ, upon request, a copy of the quotation, associated contract documentation and all receipts for expenditure relating to the Approved Project(s).
- 4.1.5. Where the cost (either estimated or based on the value of agreements) of delivering the Approved Project(s) exceeds the quotation submitted to TIQ by the Consortium Lead, the Consortium Lead will absorb these additional costs.

Project management

4.1.6. The Consortium Lead acknowledges that TIQ is funding the Approved Project(s) for the benefit of the Queensland international education and training sector ("Sector"), which includes allowing members of the Sector reasonable access to and rights of use of the Approved Project(s) and all materials relating to the Approved Project(s). The Consortium Lead will manage the Approved Project(s) in such a way to ensure this occurs.

Variations and record management

- 4.1.7. The Consortium Lead must not amend, waive or fail to give effect to any material part of an Approved Project(s) without the prior written consent of TIQ.
- 4.1.8. Proposed variations to an Approved Project(s) must be approved in writing by TIQ prior to that variation being effected. Unless otherwise agreed with TIQ, a Variation Request must:
 - a) be submitted within ten (10) business days of the requested variance being identified by the Consortium Lead;
 - b) be submitted no later than two (2) months prior to the end of the Funding Period; and
 - c) include a revised Project Plan highlighting the amendments to the Approved Project(s) and the reason for the request and, to the extent that the variation concerns project expenditure, also include updated cash-flow-forecasts.

- 4.1.9. Where a project has been delayed for any reason, the Consortium Lead must immediately notify TIQ detailing reasons for the delay and the anticipated date of recommencement.
- 4.1.10.An Approved Project may not be cancelled by the Consortium Lead without the prior written consent of TIQ. Where the Consortium Lead proposes to cancel an Approved Project for any reason, the Consortium Lead must notify TIQ and detail the reasons for the cancellation. For the purposes of this Funding Deed of Agreement, cancellation of an Approved Project is to be treated as termination of this Funding Deed of Agreement in so far as it applies to that Approved Project.
- 4.1.11.Should the Eligible Project Costs be reduced due to income confirmed from another source of funding, the Consortium Lead must notify TIQ within ten (10) business days, to enable TIQ to adjust the maximum fundable amount allowable under the relevant Funding Program.

- 4.1.14.If requested by TIQ, the Consortium lead must submit an updated Project Plan within ten (10) business days of the request.

Approved Funding

- 4.1.15. The Approved Funding must not be disbursed to or otherwise applied for the direct benefit of any other project(s), a member of the Consortium or any other third party, except to the extent that it is a consequence of and consistent with the implementation of the Approved Project in accordance with the Project Plan, without the prior written approval of TIQ.
- 4.1.16.All details of any disbursement of the Approved Funding to any other project(s), a member of the Consortium or any other third party, as approved by TIQ must be recorded in the accounts and/or accounting records prepared by the Consortium Lead in respect of each Approved Projects.

Acquittal

5.1 When making a claim for payment the Consortium Lead must:

- a) comply with the advice on making a claim included in the Formal Advice of Funding Approval; and
- b) certify the amount claimed has been properly incurred for the Approved Project(s) in accordance with this Funding Deed of Agreement, the Formal Advice of Funding Approval, the relevant Funding Program Guidelines and applicable legislative requirements and, upon request, provide a detailed transaction general ledger report, a copy of the quotation, associated contract documentation and all receipts for expenditure relating to the Approved Project (a), to support claimed expenditure.
- 5.2 All certifications under clause 5.1 must be made by an appropriately qualified officer of the Consortium Lead, or other persons as agreed by TIQ.
- 5.3 The Consortium Lead is not to make claims for payments until it has received the Formal Advice of Funding Approval, a Project Plan has been approved by TIQ in accordance with clause 4.1.2. and this Agreement has been signed by both parties.
- 5.4 Subject to TIQ being satisfied that the Consortium Lead has complied with the terms of this Funding Deed of Agreement and relevant Funding Programs and also subject to satisfaction of clause 15.5, TIQ will provide Approved Funding in accordance with the Payment Schedule. The Approved Funding will not exceed the Approved Funding percentage of the Eligible Project Cost as detailed in the Formal Advice of Funding Approval.
- 5.5 Upon the expiration of the Funding Period, TIQ's commitment to any outstanding payments will be discharged and unclaimed funding may be forfeited.

6. ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF TIQ'S FUNDING CONTRIBUTION

6,1 The Consortium Lead must acknowledge TIQ's funding contribution in accordance with the TIQ Acknowledgment Guidelines.

7 ACCESS TO PREMISES, RECORDS AND FINANCIAL ACCOUNTABILITY

- 7.1 All financial transactions incurred in the conduct of an Approved Project(s) must be separately identifiable in the Consortium Lead's books of account. All such documentation, including Tax Invoices, cheques issued and relevant bank statements must be retained by the Consortium Lead for a period of three (3) years after the Funding Period and, during this period, be made available to TIQ in accordance with Clause 7.2.
- 7.2 TIQ or its nominated agents may, on giving three (3) Business Days written notice to the Consortium Lead:

a) access the premises of the Consortium Lead;

- b) inspect and copy documentation and records, however stored, in the custody or control of the Consortium Lead to ensure compliance with all reporting and accountability requirements under this Funding Deed of Agreement and conduct audits of Approved Project(s) to determine whether the Consortium Lead is entitled to the Approved Funds in accordance with this Funding Deed of Agreement; and
- require the Consortium Lead or its employees to provide full and accurate answers to any questions concerning records or information related to an Approved Project(s).

d) undertake an audit to ensure the Consortium Lead has sound planning, governance and management practices to manage the Approved Project(s) and successfully meet its obligations under this Funding Deed of Agreement.

8 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

- 8.1 TIQ and the Consortium Lead acknowledge that any Intellectual Property created during an Approved Project(s), upon its creation, shall vest in the Consortium Lead unless otherwise agreed to in writing between the Parties.
- 8.2 The Consortium Lead grants to TiQ a non-exclusive, irrevocable, perpetual and royalty-free licence to use, adapt for its own use, modify, develop, reproduce, publish and distribute any Intellectual Property for the purpose of discharging TiQ's portfolio responsibilities of public and financial accountability and otherwise for the benefit of the Sector.
- 8.3 The Consortium Lead shall ensure that any licence which is granted to TIQ pursuant to Clause 8.2 shall also include licences to any Background Intellectual Property to enable TIQ to take the benefit of any licences to the Intellectual Property.
- 8.4 Prior to an individual commencing work on an Approved Project(s), the Consortium Lead must obtain from that individual, in writing, and provide to TiQ upon request, a consent to any act or omission (including the specific acts or omissions as may be necessary) which would otherwise infringe the Moral Rights of that individual.

9 CONFIDENTIALITY

- 9.1 The Consortium Lead shall not disclose Confidential Information belonging to TIQ except where:
 - a) It has obtained TIQ's prior written approval, which shall not be unreasonably withheld; or
 - b) disclosure is made in compliance with a lawful requirement and the Consortium Lead advises TIQ of the Information provided.
- 9.2 Subject to Clause 9.3, TIQ shall not disclose the Consortium Lead's Confidential Information except where the Consortium Lead has given its prior written approval, which shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- 9.3 Subject to Clause 8, TIQ reserves the right, in its absolute discretion and without any liability to account to the Consortium Lead or any third person, to make available, disclose and allow the disclosure of any information received from the Consortium Lead or otherwise relating to this Funding Deed of Agreement to:
 - any Commonwealth department, Queensland Government department, agency, authority or Minister;
 - b) any third person, including any court, tribunal, governmental committee or other person within government, where such disclosure would be permitted or required by law, or otherwise would be consistent with established government policies, procedures or protocols or for public accountability purposes to the extent required in those circumstances:
 - members of the Queensland public in order to publicise the benefits of Funding Program(s) and TIQ's Approved Funding of the Consortium Lead, including creating case studies and promotional materials.

9.4 The Consortium Lead and TIQ will make every reasonable effort to ensure that their employees, volunteers, agents and subcontractors are aware of and comply with the obligations in this Clause 9.

10 PRIVACY AND DISCLOSURE OF PERSONAL INFORMATION

- 10.1 Where the Consortium Lead has access to and/or is responsible for holding Personal Information, in order to fulfil its obligations under Information Privacy Act 2009 (Qld) it shall:
 - a) ensure that the Personal Information is protected against loss and against unauthorised access, use, modification or disclosure and against other misuse;
 - b) not use Personal Information other than for the purposes of this Funding Deed of Agreement, unless required or authorised by law;
 - c) not disclose Personal Information without the written agreement of the person to whom the Personal Information relates, unless required or authorised by law;
 - d) ensure that only authorised personnel have access to Personal Information;
 - e) immediately notify the person to whom the Personal Information relates if it becomes aware that a disclosure of Personal Information is or may be, required or authorised by law; and
 - f) ensure that its employees, volunteers, agents and subcontractors are aware of and comply with the obligations stated in this Clause 10.
- 10.2 Any Personal Information exchanged between TIQ and the Consortium Lead shall be dealt with in accordance with the public sector privacy regime applicable under any relevant State Government policy, legislation or subordinate law.

11 INDEMNITY AND INSURANCE

- 11.1 The Consortium Lead shall Indemnify TIQ and its officers, employees and agents ("those indemnified") from and against all actions, proceedings, claims, demands, costs (including all legal costs and all reasonable costs associated with defending those indemnified), losses, damages and expenses, including those arising out of the terms of any settlement, which:
 - a) may be brought against or made upon those indemnified; and
 - b) those indemnified may incur or sustain, arising out of or as a consequence of:
 - i) any breach of this Funding Deed of Agreement by the Consortium Lead or its directors, officers, employees, contractors or agents; or
 - any wilful, unlawful or negligent act or omission of the Consortium Lead or a Consortium member or each of their directors, officers, employees, contractors or agents, under or in connection with this Funding Deed of Agreement;
- 11.2 The Consortium Lead must, subject to the operation of competing legislative obligations, effect and maintain adequate insurance or similar coverage to cover any liability arising as a result of its undertaking of an Approved Project(s) and, if requested, provide TIQ with a copy of the relevant policies or certificates of currency, whichever is applicable. The Consortium Lead must be responsible for maintaining workers' compensation insurance for an amount required by the relevant State or Territory legislation.

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12 TERMINATION

- 12.1 If a Party defaults in the performance of its obligations under this Funding Deed of Agreement, the other Party may give a notice of default requiring the default to be rectified within a reasonable period nominated in the notice, or if no such period is nominated then, fourteen (14) days.
- 12.2 If the default is not remedied within the period specified in Clause 12.1, the non-defaulting Party may, by written notice, immediately terminate this Funding Deed of Agreement in so far as it applies to the Approved Project(s) the default relates to. To the extent that the non-defaulting Party does not terminate this Funding Deed of Agreement in so far as it applies to all Approved Projects in progress at that time, the terms of the Funding Deed of Agreement will remain in place for all other current or future Approved Projects subject to valid termination of the entire Funding Deed of Agreement by either Party. For the avoldance of doubt, this Funding Deed of Agreement does not terminate in its entirety just because there are no Approved Projects in progress and continues in effect until such time as it is terminated in accordance with Clauses 12.2 or 12.3 below.
- 12.2 Unless otherwise agreed with TIQ, the Consortium Lead may only terminate this Funding Deed of Agreement in its entirety upon 30 days' written notice to TIQ and if there are no Approved Projects in progress at the time such notice is served.
- 12.3 TIQ may, upon 30 days' written notice to the Consortium Lead and in its absolute discretion, terminate this Funding Deed of Agreement either in so far as it applies to a particular Approved Project or In its entirety without cause. Termination of this Funding Deed of Agreement in its entirety means that all Approved Projects that are in progress shall be deemed to be terminated as at the date of termination of this Funding Deed of Agreement.
- 12.4 Termination of this Funding Deed of Agreement under this Clause 12 does not affect any accrued rights or remedies of a Party.

13 CONSEQUENCES OF TERMINATION

- 13.1 In the event of termination of this Funding Deed of Agreement, either in so far as it applies to a particular Approved Project or in its entirety (any Approved Project affected by the termination being an "Affected Project"):
 - TIQ shall have no further obligation to pay Approved Funds to the Consortium Lead for an Affected Project from the date of termination of this Funding Deed of Agreement;
 - b) the Consortium Lead must take all action necessary to minimise further expenditure of Approved Funding for an Affected Project from the date notice of termination is served:
 - c) the Consortium Lead must repay any Unexpended Funds for an Affected Project, within 10 days of the date of termination;
 - d) any Approved Funding that is contractually committed to be spent must be applied in payment of any incurred but unpaid Eligible Expenditure items as at the date of termination of this Funding Deed of Agreement, including any debts or liabilities actually incurred by the Consortium Lead in relation to the Affected Project; and
 - e) the Consortium Lead will return, or upon request of TIQ, destroy all or any documents containing Confidential Information supplied by TIQ;

f) TIQ may offset any Unexpended Funds for an Affected Project against any other Approved Funding the Consortium Lead may be entitled to receive under another existing or future Approved Project(s).

14 DISPUTE RESOLUTION PROCESS

- 14.1 Both Parties agree that any dispute arising during the course of this Funding Deed of Agreement will be dealt with as follows:
 - a) firstly, the Party claiming that there is a dispute will serve notice to the other Party setting out the nature of the dispute;
 - b) secondly, the Parties will try to resolve the dispute by direct negotiation;
 - c) thirdly, the Parties have ten (10) business days from the service of the notice (or such extended time as the Parties may agree in writing before the expiration of the ten (10) business days) to reach a resolution or to agree that the dispute will be submitted to mediation with the costs and expenses of any mediation being borne equally between the Parties; and
 - d) lastly, if:
 - i) there is no resolution or agreement; or
 - there is a submission to mediation, but there is no resolution within ten (10) business days of the submission, or such extended time as the Parties may agree in writing before the expiration of the ten (10) business days, then any Party may commence legal proceedings.
- 14.2 For the purposes of mediation of the dispute under Clause 14.1(c):
 - a) mediation is to be administered by the Australian Disputes Centre Limited ("ADC"), conducted in Brisbane, Queensland and held in accordance with the ADC Guidelines for Commercial Mediation;
 - b) the Parties must procure the president of the Queensland Law Society to nominate a person to act as mediator, and the Parties must appoint the person nominated by the President as mediator; and
 - c) mediation between the Parties must occur within 20 Business Days from the date the mediator is appointed and the Parties must co-operate with the mediator in an effort to resolve the dispute.
- 14.3 Each Party shall, as far as reasonably possible, continue to perform its obligations under this Funding Deed of Agreement notwithstanding the existence of any dispute or any proceeding under this Clause 14.
- 14.4 This Clause 14 does not apply to TIQ under or purportedly under Clause 12 (Termination) nor does it preclude either party from commencing legal proceedings for urgent interlocutory relief.

15 TAX AND GST

- 15.1 In this clause 15:
 - (1) words or expressions used in this clause which have a particular meaning in the GST law (as defined in the GST Act, and also including any applicable legislative determinations and Australian Taxation Office public rulings) have the same meaning, unless the context otherwise requires;

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any reference to GST payable by a party includes any corresponding GST payable by the representative member of any GST group of which that party is a member;

- (3) any reference to an input tax credit entitlement by a party includes any corresponding input tax credit entitlement by the representative member of any GST group of which that party is a member; and
- (4) if the GST law treats part of a supply as a separate supply for the purpose of determining whether GST is payable on that part of the supply or for the purpose of determining the tax period to which that part of the supply is attributable, such part of the supply is to be treated as a separate supply.
- 15.2 Unless GST is expressly included, the consideration to be paid or provided under any other clause of this Funding Deed of Agreement for any supply made under or in connection with this Agreement does not include GST. For the avoidance of doubt, this clause applies to the Approved Funding.
- 15.3 To the extent that any supply made under or in connection with this Funding Deed of Agreement is a taxable supply, the GST exclusive consideration otherwise to be paid or provided for that taxable supply is increased by the amount of any GST payable in respect of that taxable supply and that amount must be paid at the same time and in the same manner as the GST exclusive consideration is otherwise to be paid or provided.
- 15.4 Unless an agreement has been made between the parties under clause 15.7, the Consortium Lead's right to payment under this Funding Deed of Agreement (including the Approved Funding and any amount on account of GST) is subject to a valid tax invoice being delivered to TIQ for the taxable supply made by the Consortium Lead.
- 15.5 To the extent that 1 party is required to reimburse or indemnify another party for a loss, cost or expense incurred by that other party, that loss, cost or expense does not include any amount in respect of GST for which that other party is entitled to claim an input tax credit.
- 15.6 To the extent that any consideration payable to a party under this Funding Deed of Agreement is determined by reference to a cost incurred by a party, or is determined by reference to a price, value, sales, revenue or similar amount, the GST exclusive amount of that cost, price, value, sales, revenue or similar amount must be used.
- 15.7 The Consortium Lead may request in writing that TIQ issue Recipient Created Tax Involces in respect of the taxable supplies made by the Consortium Lead under this Funding Deed of Agreement. At TIQ's sole discretion, it may decide, upon receiving such a request, to enter into an agreement with the Consortium Lead to issue Recipient Created Tax Invoices, with the form and terms of any such agreement to be determined by TIQ.
- 15.8 If it is determined on reasonable grounds that the amount on account of GST charged by the Consortium Lead under this clause 15 differs, for any reason, from the amount of GST paid or payable by the Consortium Lead, including by reason of:
 - a) any amendment to the GST Act;
 - b) the issuance of a ruling or advice by the Commissioner of Taxation; or
 - c) a refund to the Consortium Lead in respect of a supply made under this Funding Deed of Agreement,

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15.9 If TIQ is required by law to deduct or withhold from any payment to be made to the Consortium Lead an amount on account of any tax or duty, then TIQ will:

- 16.3 Subject always to Clause 17.2, in the event that the Consortium Lead transfers, with TIQ's consent, property in an Approved Project(s), the Consortium Lead must ensure that the new owner of legal or beneficial title of an Approved Project(s) shall enter into a deed whereby that person agrees that TIQ may enforce Clause 16.2 against that person as if that person was a party to this Funding Deed of Agreement. If no deed is entered into, TIQ may take action to recover the Approved Funds from the Consortium Lead.

17 GENERAL

17.1 No Agency Employee or Partnership Relationship

- a) The Consortium Lead must not represent itself and must ensure that its members and employees do not represent themselves as being an employee, partner or agent of TIQ.
- b) This Funding Deed of Agreement does not create a relationship of employment, agency or partnership between the parties.

17.2 Assignment

Unless otherwise provided for in this Funding Deed of Agreement, no Party will assign, novate, transfer, encumber or subcontract any or all of its rights or obligations under this Funding Deed of Agreement without the prior written consent of the other Party.

17.3 Entire Agreement, Variation and Severance

- a) This Funding Deed of Agreement records the entire agreement between the Parties in relation to its subject matter.
- b) The parties may, in writing, agree to vary this Funding Deed of Agreement from time to time.

17.7 Applicable Law

The laws of the State of Queensland govern this Funding Deed of Agreement and the Parties submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of Queensland.

17.8 Counterparts

If circumstances require it, the Parties may sign separate copies of this Funding Deed of Agreement and all copies (counterparts) will constitute one instrument,

17.9 Survival

Short Project Description / Elevator Pitch

This project will provide an evidence-based solution for equipping internationally trained workers the sociocultural, leadership and communication skills that are necessary for successful integration into the Queensland workforce. As is the rest of Australia, Queensland is facing an acute shortage of healthcare workers, especially in regional, rural and remote areas. Project description and project readiness

Background and suitability of the project

This project aims to address 3 priorities for the international education & training sector related to employability;

- 1. To improve the Australian employability skills (leadership & communications) of internationally qualified nursing Postgraduate students from India, enabling greater rates of successful Australian industry placement and helping to address acute Nursing shortages in regional Queensland
- 2. To increase high-quality Postgraduate student attraction from India by positioning Queensland and our consortium as a leader in nursing employability through the involvement and engagement of our network of >12 Indian nursing Universities
- 3. To accelerate the development of Australian employability skills (leadership & communications) of international graduate students in areas of professional skills shortage across multiple fields and geographies, helping Queensland meet its future workforce needs particularly in regional areas

The Productivity Commission report on health workforce [1] highlighted that Australia was experiencing workforce shortages across a number of health professions. More recent nursing workforce planning projections conducted by Health Workforce Australia [2] showed that in the medium to long-term, Australia's demand for nurses will significantly exceed supply (with a projected shortfall of approximately 85,000 nurses by 2025, or 123,000 nurses by 2030).

This issue is more acute in Queensland's regional and remote areas - including the Gold Coast and Far North Queensland. To address this shortage, Australian nurses are being encouraged to return to practice and internationally qualified registered nurses (IQNs) are being encouraged to practice in Australia [3] through improved education and training opportunities [4]). Over the past decade, there has been a growing interest by IQNs to become registered in Australia and nursing is in the combined list of eligible skilled occupations which can be filled by skilled migrants who apply for a Subclass 482 Temporary Skill Shortage (TSS) visa (the replacement for the 457 visa abolished in 2017).

In addition to recognition of IQN experience, there are significant sociocultural issues facing their integration into the Australia health workforce. In particular, nurses trained in India come from a system where they were inadequately positioned in the overall hierarchy of patient care-teams, were poorly recognised for their clinical and public health decision making and lack the leadership and critical thinking skills required in Australia. In Australia, it is very challenging to place Postgraduate nursing students in industry practicums with regional health services and private healthcare providers.

The project seeks to address educational opportunities for IQNs originally trained in India and enhance their experience and employability for the delivery of health services in regional, rural and remote Queensland. This project specifically addresses the identified need for communication and leadership skills education for Indian trained nurses in order for them to successfully integrate into the Australian nursing workforce.

Consortium suitability

Our consortium is comprised of nursing and midwifery staff at Southern Cross University (Gold Coast), Central Queensland University, James Cook University, the Academy of Higher Education (Mand Research (KAHER): Institute of Nursing Science as well as the experiential learning technology of Practera.

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Southern Cross University's School of Health and Human Sciences (SHHS) delivers a variety of healthcare courses relevant to this application at both undergraduate (Bachelor of Nursing) and postgraduate levels (Masters in Healthcare Leadership and the Graduate Certificate in Australian Nursing). In 2016, the inaugural Graduate Certificate in Australian Nursing program was delivered at SCU's Gold Coast Campus. The program was the first of its kind in Australia, designed to support internationally qualified nurses (IQNs) transitioning into the Australian workforce.

The program builds on prior knowledge, skills and nursing experience to develop a deeper understanding of nursing in the Australian healthcare context. The program evaluation supported the international evidence that acculturation impacts on IQNs quality of life, their ability to adapt and overall satisfaction with the work environment. Of interest, the IQNs from India (approximately 40% of the student cohort) indicated that they lacked confidence, and indicated the need for support and time to develop communication and leadership skills.

In 2017, SHHS engaged with Professor Radhi from KAHER Institute of Nursing Science to gain a deeper understanding of the nursing culture and curricula in India, in order to support the students enrolled in the Graduate Certificate in Australian Nursing. Professor Radhi and her team, with the support of SHHS, conducted a large survey of over 700 nursing students and graduates to explore perceived education needs. Interestingly, results of the survey identified a need for communication and leadership skills education in order to create impact on teamwork, supervision and respect. We have continued and extended our discussions with Professor Radhi and her colleagues in surrounding regions, particularly regarding the scalability and sustainability of the initiative for training of nurses in India.

Practera is an experiential learning and micro-credentialling platform and startup company. Practera enables educators to build, deliver their own branded experiential learning apps to support programs like team projects, simulations, study abroad, internships, accelerators, mentoring networks and skills micro-credentialing. Practera has successfully delivered innovative employability skills products in India and has 4 staff either from India or with extensive experience there. Universities are deploying the software to enable large scale programs which link tens of thousands of students from dozens of Universities with hundreds of employers to build innovation, cross-cultural and employability skills.

Recently Practera have been recognized in the NSW international student awards, as a 'Westpac Business of Tomorrow', a US AWS edstart awardee, an 'EY Accelerating Entrepreneurs Asia-Pacific' winner, and were announced as one of the initial investments for Main Sequence Ventures, the CSIRO innovation fund.

Project objectives

The project has three key objectives;

- 1. To develop and pilot with >500 post-graduate nursing students & recent alumni and professional practice nurse mentors, an innovative digitally enabled India-Australia employability skills (leadership & communications) training & mentoring program
- 2. To input to a proposed collaborative project with 12 Indian institutions to design and pilot an aligned program and supporting edtech product for professional placement within India with a large student population. Up to 40% of Indian nursing graduates from these institutions will seek to undertake further education & practice in overseas jurisdictions and our consortium is well positioned to increase regional Queensland's share of this addressable market.
- 3. To develop from the pilot a generic Study Queensland cross-cultural professional placement & practitioner mentoring app available on commercial terms to all Queensland providers, readily adaptable to different fields and geographies through the addition of specialised content

However, this was down 2% from 2016, this is 13% of Australian enrolments vs Qld average of 15.5%. India has been highlighted recently by the Queensland Government and TIQ as a priority growth market for international education.

While the project will specifically explore skill development with IQNs from India to enhance their employability in Queensland, we very much view this as a pilot for equipping any Internationally trained worker with sociocultural, leadership or other skills to facilitate their employability in Queensland.

Through our partnering with Central Queensland University, we will be able to explore our solution across regional Queensland from the Gold Coast through to the Far North.

Expected outcomes

A program impact framework across inputs, activities, outputs, outcomes and impact has been developed to articulate outcomes and lead and lag success indicators & measures;

>100 Internationally trained qualified nurses (IQNs) from India

Project implementation

The workshop will be held for 200+ alumni from the SCU Graduate Certificate in Australian Nursing students and an additional 300 Registered Nurses from India currently working in Queensland, including nurses identified through our partners at Central Queensland University and James Cook University. Workshop will be held at the Gold Coast campus of Southern Cross University and will involve communication and leadership strategies including:

• using a decision-making frame work in order to improve patient safety and outcomes

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- to deliver comprehensive, safe and effective evidence-based nursing care to achieve identified health outcomes.
- · working as an individual and as part of a multidisciplinary health care team
- to develop chronic care planning in consultation with the patient/client, their significant others and the multidisciplinary team.
- · use of mobile technologies for reflection and engagement with mentorship.

It is our experience that workshops have little impact if participants do not subsequently put into practice the information they have learned. We therefore aim to explore the effectiveness of the content delivered in the Communication and Leadership workshop by engaging with participants in a follow up trial of a digital mentorship solution (Practera)

Using Practera, participants will be able to reflect on their implementation of content delivered in the Workshops. Participants will be grouped into teams and connected via the Practera solution with a mentor for ongoing support, feedback and practice improvement.

Mentors will be drawn from experienced nurses and nursing academics in Queensland. During the trial, program participants will engage in learning and associated assessment activities for presentation at a Queensland Nursing conference to be held on the Gold Coast

We expect the outcomes of the pilot trial will be:

- reinforcement of the workshop content
- · implementation of skills learned
- generation of data to support ongoing improvement of Leadership workshops that address different areas of nursing practice, for example in age care or mental health.

This pilot trial will form part of a PhD research project for a student from either India or Australia.

Reporting outcomes

Learning outcomes will include an understanding of:

- reflective practice and the importance of nurses within the health care team to deliver high quality and safe health care
- importance of integrated health care and how nurses work cooperatively and collaboratively with other health care professionals
- the role of the registered nurse within the multidisciplinary team

Following the trial of the solution we aim to analyse and report the data in a peer reviewed publication in an international nursing journal. Presentation of the results of the trial will be made available online and out team will deliver results at national and international conferences. At the completion of the project we are considering developing a workshop to educate other education and training organisations about ways in which they could use the mobile mentoring and support solution for application across different domains.

We also believe that the solution will be a cost effective way for education providers in Queensland to add value to their international students. As such we are keen to explore development of a 'generic' Study Queensland app which could be easily adaptable with market specific and discipline specific content, with re-configuration by Practera. We expect that this solution would be in the order of low thousands of dollars per new program and commercial rollout costs for a 6 month professional practice program estimated at \$45 / student.

Project assessment

Assessment criteria 1

The International Education and Training Partnership Fund 2018-19 (Round Two) aims to prioritise the development of high quality, scalable and impactful employability initiatives aligned to the published Study Queensland 2018-19 employability roadmap, and emerging directions of a four-year international employability strategy which builds on and aligns to that roadmap.

To improve the employability skills of internationally qualified nurses from India to enable Australian industry placement and address acute Nursing shortages in regional Queensland, Southern Cross University intends to provide an innovative digitally enabled India-Australia employability training & mentoring program for postgraduate nursing students undertaking industry practicums with area health services and private providers throughout regional Queensland. This would also help position Queensland and SCU as a leader in nursing employability training within Australia and with our network of >12 Indian nursing Universities.

Assessment criteria 2

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Study Queensland's employability roadmap identified the availability of well targeted, high quality employability and training experiences for international students as a key priority.

Southern Cross University offers a Graduate Certificate in Australian Nursing to support IQNs transitioning in the Australian workforce and is the first of its kind in Australia to enhance the experience and employability skills of IQNs. Through this project, SCU along with its partners seek to specifically address the identified need for communication and leadership skills education for Indian trained nurses in order for them to successfully integrate into the Australian nursing workforce.

SCU is proposing to invest in a leadership and communication training workshop for for the Indian IQNs to augmenting student experience and provide enhanced employability skills through an innovative mobile training and mentorship platform, Practera.

Along with the technology, Practera will help SCU design and implement an effective, light touch operating model to contextualise, quality assure, reinforce and support the technology.

Practera will provide a standard Practera design and configuration, content design and licensing services to develop and pilot with >100 SCU postgraduate nursing students from India. Practera will also provide technical helpdesk 24/7, 24-hour response time and 95% uptime.

Assessment criteria 3

The model aims to very clearly document and systematise this approach of providing this digitally enabled unique employability training and mentoring program as a replicable 'package' that could be adopted by other Queensland regional clusters or professional practice education providers. Further, student experiences from pre-destination choice through onshore study, to alumni can be built on Practera. This program can develop from a generic pilot version of the India-Australia employability training & mentoring program for adaptation in other fields of professional practice in Queensland. A successfully delivered program will result in satisfied employers and these benefitting employers might also have operations elsewhere in Queensland and would be natural partners in establishing a robust network of similar programs with shared learnings and potentially common operational assets & technology.

Assessment criteria 4

The proposed 'Digital Mentorship' project can commence in April 2019, with SCU collaboratively working with partners to design and deliver an engaging mobile experiential learning capability to apply workshop learning to work to a pilot cohort of >100 postgraduate students, with a substantial scale roll out, if the project objectives are met.

Through this consortium, SCU along with its partners - BUPA and two Area Health Services, intend to build a local collaborative ecosystem to provide opportunities pertaining practicum placements throughout regional Queensland, upskilling of the workforce and building Australian service provision in both the Area Health Service and BUPA. SCU along with partners believe that there are Government and Industry bodies across sectors, who would be ready to help us rapidly adapt, implement and scale this model. This approach de-risks the project and provides confidence in our ability to deliver.

Assessment criteria 5

The 'Digital Mentoring' program will be a unique experiential learning mentoring program and a major platform asset for the SCU, generating regular positive marketing events & material, student employment opportunities and articulating into new direct employer-provider relationships.

Within Queensland, Study Gold Coast is also pursuing a similar model. Between SCU's 'Digital Mentoring' program and Study Gold Coast, shared learnings and potentially common operational assets & technology will have been developed in 2019 to help introduce this concept in other Queensland jurisdictions.
