

STUDENT SATISFACTION SURVEY REGARDING TEACHING – LEARNING AND EVALUATION







The feedback form of students on curriculum was distributed to all the students of the institute and given instructions to select the most appropriate option of the items in the form. For the analysis, only 3 questions could be considered as the other 2 questions were to be expressed in words. Out of the 304 students of the institute given, 267 students gave Contemporary feedback on curriculum and 298 students felt that the curriculum needed improvement and only 9 students expressed an obsolete feedback. Regarding the strength of the curriculum, 276 students reported good and 23 students gave satisfactory report and only 5 students were unsatisfied. The last question for analysis was regarding the weakness of the curriculum, where 257 students opted no weakness, 39 students minimum weakness and 8 students opted for option of weakness.


